Olathe Rotary Paul Harris Fellows for the 2017-2018 Rotary Year

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris. The Chicago attorney formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships, and give back to their communities.

The Paul Harris Fellow program recognizes individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to <u>The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International</u>. (Can accumulate through recurring gifts, or given all at one time.) The honor was established in 1957 to show appreciation for contributions that support our Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant. To recognize someone else as a Paul Harris Fellow, a Rotarian can give that amount in their name. The recipient does not need to be a Rotarian.

Rotarians who give \$1000 annually become members of the Paul Harris Society.

The Rotary Foundation has a <u>four-star rating from Charity Navigator</u>, an evaluator of U.S. charities. The rating, which is the highest that Charity Navigator assigns, reflects the Rotary Foundation's sound fiscal management and commitment to accountability and transparency. Through Paul Harris and Paul Harris Society gifts, members are supporting work in Rotary's six areas of focus: promoting peace, fighting disease, providing clean water, saving mothers and children, supporting education, and growing local economies around the world.

*****Not only will Paul Harris gifts help Rotarians reach out and touch mankind all over the world, a large portion of a club's contributions to The Rotary Foundation, will be returned to that club's district in the form of District Grants to help local clubs with the resources needed to spread these great programs to those most in need of them in their own communities.

Olathe Rotary is proud to have 339 Paul Harris Fellows named since 1977!

Our Rotary Foundation drive is normally in October and November, but donations are accepted any time during the Rotary year (7/1/18 - 6/30/19).
