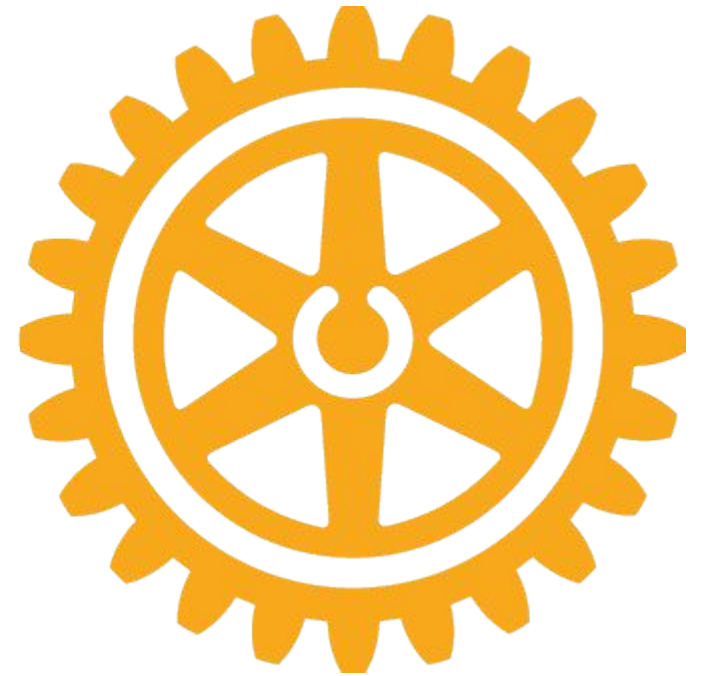

Brief History of Rotary

- 1905 - Paul Harris organizes first meeting which then “rotates” among members’ offices so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships.
- 1907 - Rotary’s first community service project - Rotary Club of Chicago provides public toilet outside Chicago’s City Hall.
- 1907 - The Rotary Foundation was established. The first contribution was \$26.50 and was made by Club 13 - the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri.
- 1914 - The Rotary Club of Topeka (FKA Downtown Topeka Rotary Club) was formed .
- 1976 - The Topeka Rotary Foundation was established. 2

The 1989 Council on Legislation established Service Above Self as the principal motto of Rotary because it best conveys the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service.

- Save mothers and children
- Support Education
- Grow local economies
- Protect the environment

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- The development of **acquaintance** as an opportunity for service;
- **High ethical standards** in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- The application of the ideal of **service** in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;
- The advancement of **international understanding**, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four Way Test

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
