Neal, a Mourning HOPE Grief Center Volunteer, grew up in Utica, Nebraska, population 570. My Father left farming when I was young. He became a successful and well known auctioneer in Seward County. Around the same time he developed an independent insurance agency and was a real estate broker. All this was accomplished with an 8th grade education. My Mother qualified for a Regent's Scholarship but because of the financial difficulties of the times, was unable to attend college. She was the force that prioritized post-secondary education for all of her children.

My professional career was focused on children and education, including teaching, counseling and coaching. I am now retired. I have facilitated groups at Mourning HOPE Grief Center over the past twenty-three years. During that

time, I have gained much personal meaning, met many remarkable people and developed wonderful friendships. It is an honor to speak with the Lincoln East Rotary Club about Mourning HOPE.

Mission Statement

Mourning Hope companions grieving children, teens, young adults and their families when someone significant in their lives has a serious illness or has died. Mourning Hope provides support groups, community education, grief resources and referrals.

A definition of "companioning:"

- Companioning is a philosophy of working with the bereaved developed by Alan Wolfelt, Ph.D. It refers to "walking along-side" each grieving child and family in their pain, without urgency or judgment.
- ♦ Companioning is not about imposing order or logic, leading, "fixing the pain" or stopping its expression at our own discomfort.
- Companioning is being fully present to another's grief; being willing to "go into the wilderness of their pain with them."
- Companioning is accepting the reconciliation each individual can find with his or her loss.

We acknowledge that bereavement practices vary in profound ways depending on cultural background. The Center will create an environment that honors the culturally distinct mourning rituals, traditions, and behavioral expressions of grief experienced by program participants.

In partnership with our staff and volunteers, and in collaboration with other organizations that share our goals, we will commit our resources to programs that are ethically, socially and financially responsible.

With patience, empathy, openness and a willingness to listen with our hearts and minds, Mourning Hope humbly companions each person who seeks support.
