




Dr. Ian Newman biography: Retired Wesley C Mierhenry Henry distinguished Prof. College of Education and Human Sciences. UNL. Born and early education in New Zealand. Last degree (Ph.D.) from the University of Illinois. Completed a post doc at Harvard School of Public Health. Behavioral scientists interested in behaviors that affect health. Worked for the World Health Organization out of the Southeast Asian office in New Delhi, India. Traveled and taught extensively around the world for 50 years. Early research interests focused on tobacco use and for the last 35 years on alcohol use and the prevention of high-risk alcohol use. At UNL headed the Nebraska Prevention Center for Alcohol and Drug Abuse and the Nebraska Collegiate Consortium to Reduce High-Risk Drinking.

For the last 25 years has been involved in itinerant teaching in China while focusing his research interest on the role of alcohol use in Chinese society and developing several tools for estimating alcohol use among Chinese students: The Chinese Alcohol Expectancy Scale, the Chinese Cultural Orientation Scale, and the Chinese Alcohol Self Efficacy Scale.

Ian Newman PhD reported on his June trip to visit the Zambia project. He graphically described the scene of villagers coming together for child health day, a well dedication and soccer tournament. He was impressed with Taylor Josephy, the project director's role as a community developer and the human spirit of the local villagers which he called human capital.

He showed a graph projecting that in the Muzya catchment area of 7,000 people they expected 378 pregnancies, 361 will deliver at the clinic resulting in 343 lives births, evidence that work is needed to reduce this mortality.

He also visited the new region that our next grant is targeting i.e. Masanzya. The school master there related to Ian the problems that confront the school: children come to school exhausted because they walk long distances to get water prior to attending school. The villagers failed to see the value of school so he developed a soccer league and organized a child health clinic at the same the games were held. This strategy is behind the community coming together to improve the lives of the local folks. Our grant will be a valuable asset in taking advantage of this.


