

- ♦ Grew from 800 members in 1995 to almost 3,000 members in 2017

Growth in the Organic Market

- ♦ From 2005 to 2016 organic food sales grew 197%
- ♦ From 13.8 billion dollars of sales to 43 billion dollars of sales
- ♦ Dairy is the second highest selling organic food category.

Growth in Organic Acres

- ♦ 1,723,270 acres of cropland in 2005 and 8,493 certified organic farms
- ♦ 4,100,000 acres of cropland in 2016 and 14,979 certified organic farms
- ♦ 137% growth in acres and 76% growth in certified organic farms
