HEB ROTARY INDUCTION FEE AND QUARTERLY CHARGES

The following Fees and Dues apply to membership in the Rotary Club of HEB.

- **Induction Fee:** \$100 - Payable upon receipt of invoice. Must be paid before becoming a member.
- **Paul Harris Foundation:** \$100 Every Rotarian Every Year. Billed Quarterly @ \$25/quarter.
- **Dues:** \$400 per year. Billed quarterly @ \$100/quarter
- **Meals:** \$12 each meeting. Billed quarterly. (If you do not eat, the charge is \$5 each meeting)
- **Gold Cup:** \$1 per meeting. Placed in the Gold Cup and the center of your table.
