OUR HISTORY

The Rotary Club of Falls Church has been an integral part of the community since its chartering on June 30, 1952 by the Rotary Club of Arlington.



We are part of Rotary District 7610, which covers the northern and eastern regions of Virginia. Our club's banner design is from the small colonial Falls Church, which

obtained its name from the nearby Little Falls of the Potomac River. We are a small club "with big impact"! Our members are from all corners of the world, and we are diverse in ages, genders, and professions as well.

Rotary International is a worldwide organization of business and professional leaders, providing humanitarian service and encouraging high ethical standards in all vocations. As members of the oldest service club in the world, Rotarians represent a cross-section of their community's business owners, executives, managers, political leaders, and professionals – people of all ages who make decisions and influence policy.

Best of all, our members build life-long friendships and networks through fellowship – and obtain personal fulfillment by providing volunteer service to others.



OUR CLUB PROJECTS

Our club projects cover the **Rotary Five Avenues of Service**: Community Service, International Service, Club Service, Vocational Service, and Youth. We select our service projects based on the local needs of our community and international interest areas. Our members work on projects

relating to health, hunger, environmental concerns such as clean water, literacy and education.

One of our club's priorities is youth, because investing in them is our future. Our Club sponsors local students in the District annual student competitions: Speech Contest for high school students; G. Graham Green III Music Contest for high schoolers; Essay Contest for middle schoolers.

Interact is Rotary for ages 14-18. We sponsor 2 clubs and activities at Bishop O'Connell High School Club & Thomas Jefferson High School for Science & Technology. We provide an annual Interactors college scholarship award.

Youth Exchange Student - selected students have the opportunity to study abroad.

Group Study Exchange - young adults participate in exchange visits to different countries each year. We sponsored the 2010 GSE team to Jamaica.

World Peace Scholar - nominated student selected by Rotary International to study abroad.
