To promote the recognition of the worthiness of all legitimate occupations, and to dignify each member's occupation as affording him an opportunity to serve society.
To encourage high ethical standards in business and professions.
To increase the efficiency of each member by the exchange of ideas and business methods.
To promote the scientizing of acquaintance as an opportunity for service and an aid to success.
To quicken the interest of each member in the public welfare and to co-operate with others in civic development.

ARTICLE III.

#### MEMBERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS.

MEMBERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS.

SECTION 1. Any adult male person of good moral character, who is engaged as proprietor, partner, corporate officer, agent or manager in full charge in any legitimate business or professional undertaking, in the County of Summit, State of Ohio, shall be eligible to membership unless engaged in an occupation already represented by a member. His classification as a member shall be that of his principal and recognized occupation. Membership is that of the individual and not of his firm or corporation.

#### ARTICLE V

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors, and to perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office.

#### VICE-PRESIDENT.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-President in the absence of the President to preside at all meetings of the Club, and to perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office.

SECRETARY.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of business transacted, send out notices of meetings and perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office or are provided for herein. It shall also be the duty of the Secretary to keep record of the membership and attendance.

TREASURER.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold custody of all funds, accounting for same to this Club at its monthly and annual meetings and at any other time upon demand by the Board of Directors; and on his retirement from office to turn over to his successor or to the President all funds in his possession, and to perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office or are provided for herein.

SECTION 5. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall preserve order at all meetings and perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to this office.

Section 6. Election to membership shall be in the following manner: A person shall be considered for membership only when proposed by two members. The proposal shall be on the Club's regular application blank and shall contain the name, address, proposed business or professional classification and a statement of the qualifications of the person for membership, etc. The Secretary will submit such proposal to Board of Directors, to reasonably fill classification, and then pass on to the Membership Committee. If the Membership Committee, by a majority vote, recommend the acceptance of said proposal, such fact shall be certified to the Secretary, who will submit it back to the Board of Directors, and if approved by a majority of the Board, the Secretary shall then cause a notice to be mailed out to each member at least ten days prior to the date of meeting at which the Club shall vote on such name. Written protests to the President against the admission of any candidate on the ground of conflict in business or professional representation may be made within one week after date of notice, and any such protest shall be forthwith decided by the Board of Directors. If the Board decides that a conflict exists, the proposed shall be deemed rejected, and the name of the proposed placed on the waiting list. If no such protest is filed, a vote may be taken on the question of the admission to membership of such per-

Section 2. It is understood that any person accepting active partnership or associate membership thereby signifies his desire to be recorded as a subscriber to the official magazine publication of the International Association of Rotary Clubs in full accordance with the by-laws of this club.

Section 3. Partners of members, officers of corporations already represented not to exceed two in number of any member or represented corporation, who occupy positions involving the use of discretionary power, shall on motion of such member or corporate representative, become eligible to membership; provided, however, that membership under this section shall not endure longer than the connection of such member with his proposer or represented corporation, nor longer than the membership of such proposer.

Section 4. Honorary Members may be elected at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by the unanimous vote of the members in attendance, providing a proposal for such membership shall have been made at a previous regular meeting. Nonresidents of Summit County, retired business or professional men, and representatives of corporations or associations not for pecuniary gain, shall be eligible to honorary membership. Honorary members shall have the privilege of attending meetings and participating in the social functions of the club. They shall not be required to pay dues.

Section 5. Membership shall endure for life (unless forfeited or resigned as herein provided), or until the member abandons the particular

BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

SECTION 6. The Board of Directors, consisting of eleven members of the Club, three of whom shall be the President, Vice-President, and Secretary, respectively, shall constitute the governing body of this Club, and their decision on all matters shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Club. It shall have general control over all officers and committees and may for good cause declare any office or offices vacant. It shall constitute a Board of Appeals from the rulings of all officers and actions of all committees. Appeal may be taken from any decision of the Board of Directors to the Club, and such appeal shall be determined by majority vote at any regular meeting.

SECTION 7. All officers and directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Club to be held on the second Monday in February of each year. Four directors shall be elected at each annual meeting to serve two years. In the event of any office becoming vacant, it shall be filled temporarily by the Board of Directors and permanently at the next regular meeting of the Club.

ARTICLE VI

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by a two-third vote of all members present, provided that notice of such proposed amendment shall have been mailed to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting.

SECTION 8. Any member who refuses or neglects to pay any indebtedness due to the Club within ten days after demand has been made by registered letter, shall thereby forfeit his membership.

SECTION 9. If any member shall absent himself from four successive meetings of the Club without good cause, and if in the judgment of the Board of Directors said member is not active and interested in the objects and work of the Club, the Board of Directors, may, with or without notice, terminate his membership. bership.

SECTION 10. Any member whose connection with this Club shall be severed by resignation, death, expulsion or otherwise, shall forfeit all interest in any property belonging to the Club.

#### ARTICLE IV OFFICERS.

The officers of this Club shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### ENTERTAINMENT COMMITTEE.

The Entertainment Committee shall prepare and arrange programs for the regular meetings; they shall prepare and arrange such social functions as may be directed by the Board of Directors or the Club: also devise and put into execution plans for the entertainment of the members at the meetings.

ARTICLE I

MEETINGS.

SECTION 1. Regular meetings of the Akron Rotary Club shall be held on the second and fourth Mondays of each month, except the months of July and August, or as otherwise directed by the Board of Directors.

There shall be a membership fee of \$10.00 (ten dollars) required of all members on admission to this Club, in addition to the annual dues. The membership dues shall be \$20.00 (twenty dollars) per annum (to include the cost of the monthly dinners) for the purpose of meeting the current expenses of the Club, and shall be payable March first in advance, and any extra assessments may be authorized by the Board of Directors.

OFFICIAL PUBLICATION. SECTION 1. Each member shall sign a yearly subscription for the Official Magazine Publication of the International Association of Rotary Clubs. The subscription shall be collected by the Club from its members as part of the regular dues. The Secretary shall enter such subscription on his books in a special subscription account and shall forward the same to the business office of said publication as a Club subscription. matters affecting the public welfare of interest to members; and shall devise and execute plans for the up-building of the City of Akron.

#### GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE.
