

- \$40M annual revenue organization FYE22 (March 22)
- Direct Service programming at the center of what we do.
- Campaign Revenue is about 1/3 of total revenue each year.
- Donor designations are less than \$1M annually, from over \$8M in 2015.
- Two acquisitions of area non-profits since 2018.




