Riverton Rotary Club Details and Expectations

It is easy to stay a member in good standing with the Riverton Rotary Club! To be considered a member in good standing you must attend weekly meetings, get involved in other avenues of the club, and stay up to date on club dues.

Attendance: There are no attendance requirements, but we do ask that you attend lunches as often as possible and aim for three meetings a month. Meetings take place every Tuesday at 12:00 PM and lunch is provided. We are currently meeting at the CWC Intertribal Center, in Room 116.

Avenues of Involvement: There are multiple ways to be involved in Riverton Rotary Club and one of these ways is through Club Committees. The club has 5 committees currently – Membership, International Service, Fundraising, Community Service, and Vocational Services - everyone is asked to join one committee. Let us know which committees you might be interested in and we can provide more details so that you pick something that is the right fit for you!

Attending Service Projects is another way to be involved with the club outside of lunch. We try to provide a couple service projects per quarter that range from passing out dictionaries to local students to helping at the local food pantry. Please volunteer when you can.

Dues: Dues are billed on a quarterly basis and cover your Riverton Rotary Club membership, your District membership, your Rotary International membership, and weekly meals at CWC. Each quarterly billing is \$200.00, for an annual total of \$800.00.

All dues and fees need to be made payable to Riverton Rotary Club and mailed to P.O. Box 218 Riverton, WY 82501 or handed to our Club Treasurer at a weekly meeting. Dues can be paid by individual members or by employers, but individual members are the responsible party.

Occasionally there are additional costs – It is \$10 to bring a guest to lunch, and our annual Gavel Exchange is a catered event costing between \$15-\$40 per person.

<u>Club History</u>

The Riverton Rotary Club was Chartered in 1979. The Lander Rotary Club sponsored our club's formation, consisting of several Lions Club members and other community leaders. These forward thinking individuals took on the concept of "Service Above Self" in the pursuit of the five Avenues of Service: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, International Service, and Youth Service.

Our Club was chartered during the "Men's Club" era but was one of the earliest clubs in the world to welcome female members. The Riverton Rotary Club is proud to have a collaborative relationship with the other service clubs in the area, as we share visions of community pride and success with our neighbors.

The largest investment that the Riverton Rotary Club makes is in humanity. We invest thousands of dollars annually in our area offering youth generous scholarships for further education. Our club has been a regular financial supporter of Rotary International including its drive to arrest and eliminate proliferation of communicable diseases. The Riverton Rotary Club is also an active participant in Rotary International Youth Exchange program offering ambassadorial inbound and outbound experience to students around the world.

We also have a huge profile in physical community enhancements including:

- Erection of the Band Shell in Riverton Central Park
- Construction of several peripheral green areas along the Rails to Trails corridor and city entrances.
- Erection and placement of pedestrian support items including a memorial gazebo west of town and a dog watering station
- Construction and maintenance of the Fire Pit alongside the Riverton River Walk.
- And a current project receiving City of Riverton endorsement: construction of a dog park adjacent to the Riverton River walk.

The Riverton Rotary Club focuses daily on Service Above Self as a community of friends and business acquaintances that enjoy working together and each other's company.
