News from Kenya – rebuild

Since our last newsletter there have been many changes at the nursery school. With the very generous help of Forest Hill Rotary and Albert Park Rotary, a new school building has been constructed. The previous building was made with corrugated iron on a cement base. The new building instead retains a cement base, but has brick walls, tiled floors and is ready for solar panels to be installed.

The main goal of the project is to provide more power to the school to enable lights to be installed. There is no elec-

tricity in the region, so solar-powered the lights would make the school a place where older children who live in the area (particularly girls) have a safe place to study at night. It will also provide an evening meeting place for community meetings and the like. Well done to Georgina and the team in Kenya for an amazing effort so far. We look forward to seeing the finished product soon.



You may be aware that Kenya has recently had a national election and unfortunately the aftermath has seen violence and uncertainty. Election time is always a challenge in Kenya, whichever political party loses the election invariably claims that the election process has been rigged. Access to food and services drops off and it is stressful for everyone, but particularly for those in remote areas like Katolo. These challenges have seen the budget stretched significantly on the re-build and solar panel project.

An email request to Katolo supporters, however, has reinvigorated the project and absolutely put it back on track. Leanne and I are continually amazed at the generosity of the wider family of people who support this humble nursery school. The response to the email was phenomenal and we cannot thank you all enough for such generosity, particularly at this time of year. Thank you so much.

They also enjoyed a boat ride. For most of the children this is the only time that they will venture so far from the village until adulthood, so it is an incredible experience for them.

Some of you may not be aware that the nursery school has a very large vegetable patch and some housing for chickens and a cow. These were built a few years ago, with the help of money from Forest Hill and Nunawading Rotary Groups. Recently our Dad, Des Pinfold, donated some money towards a new cow!
