We hope that this newsletter finds you well. As usual, we have had a cracking few months of exciting work for the Hope Katolo Nursery School. Leanne and I have been busy fundraising here in Australia, with the help of some amazing, self-less and generous supporters of the school. Georgina, the staff and kids in Kenya have also had a very busy few months, made a little more complicated by a long-ish dry season that justified every last cent that was spent on the several water tanks.



You were no doubt alarmed to read in our last newsletter that 15% of the children attending the nursery school are HIV+ and a further 20% are either suspected of being HIV+ or their immediate family has been diagnosed. Ten percent of the children attending the nursery school are total orphans, most often due to AIDS related illness. The good news is that Georgina and the staff at the nursery school came up with a great suggestion of a sick bay, to make sure that these children are able to continue to attend the school and access the much-needed feeding program, but rest as required. It is with huge thanks to Forest Hill Rotary, the work on the sick bay is now completed and it is being equipped with basic amenities.

Thanks also to Forest Hill for hosting Melanie at another inspiring and fun evening on the 1st of May.

#### HOPE KATOLO NURSERY SCHOOL KENYA

#### 2007

Melanie Haley and Leanne Pinfold volunteer in Katolo, Kenya, and meet Georgina Malanga who is running a nursery school out of a small church building. There is no access to clean water, minimal access to food, no toileting facilities, no access to



electricity or other power sources and the teaching staff receive no income. Whilst in Kenya, Leanne and Melanie along with 2 other volunteers purchase land in Katolo to build the new Hope Katolo Nursery School. The feeding program is commenced. Georgina as head teacher, three teachers, two cooks and a night security guard are employed.

#### 2008

The main 3- classroom school building and 2 pit toilets are constructed. The staff receive a regular income for the first time in their lives.

The Hope Katolo Nursery School kitchen, complete with 2 wood-fired ovens, is constructed.

#### $\overline{2}\overline{0}\overline{1}\overline{0}$

Solar panels are installed on the roof of the kitchen as sourcing electricity from the national grid is not a viable option in Katolo. The power provided allows use of a laptop computer and small electrical appliances.

### $\overline{2}\overline{0}\overline{1}\overline{1}$

In May, the Pinfold family visit Hope Katolo Nursery School. New water tanks are purchased and Georgina is rewarded for all her hard work with a new bicycle. The bicycle allows for easier commuting to town for supplies or to take unwell students to the local medical centre.

In June, after a long period of drought, the rains come. The result is terrible floods in Katolo. The supporters of Hope Katolo Nursery School help to finance the clean up afterwards.

**2013** A staff office is constructed.

#### 2014

In February Georgina comes to visit Leanne and Melanie. During her 5 week stay Georgina gets to meet many supporters of Hope Katolo Nursery School. Lots of fundraising nights are held in which \$9,000 is raised.

#### 2015

The focus turns to greater sustainability of Hope Katolo Nursery School. The school community is now the proud owner of a cow, chickens and a fabulous veggie patch. A plan for ongoing maintenance of the school is put into place.

Construction of a new sick bay provides a place of rest for the children of the school, of which approx. 15% are HIV positive at this time.

#### **10 Year Anniversary**

n our 10 year anniversary, over \$140,000 AUD has been raised to provide education and sustenance to approximately 90 children per year.

The school now consists of a large 3 room school building, an office for staff, a kitchen, pit toilets, 6 water tanks, solar panels, a vegetable patch, a sick bay, a chook shed, a cow shed



and play equipment for the children. This is all protected by a perimeter fence and gate.

In the 10 years, over 180 children have graduated to Primary School. Over 160,000 meals have been served and over 450 school uniforms have been made. Tank water enables hydration and better hygiene for over 100 people each year.
