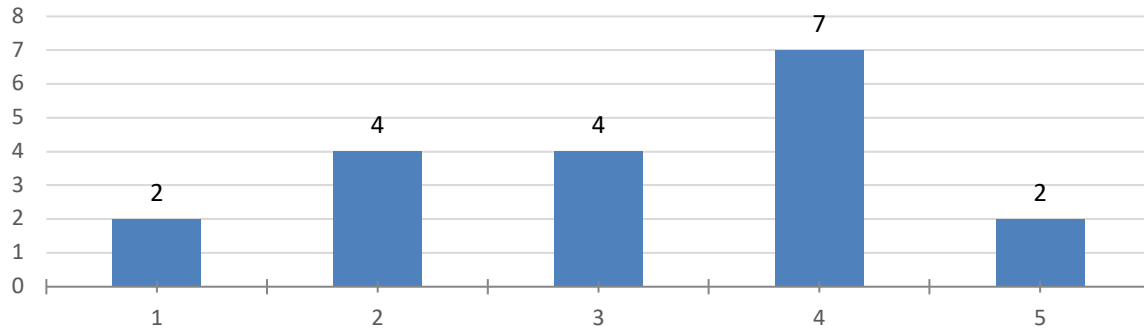


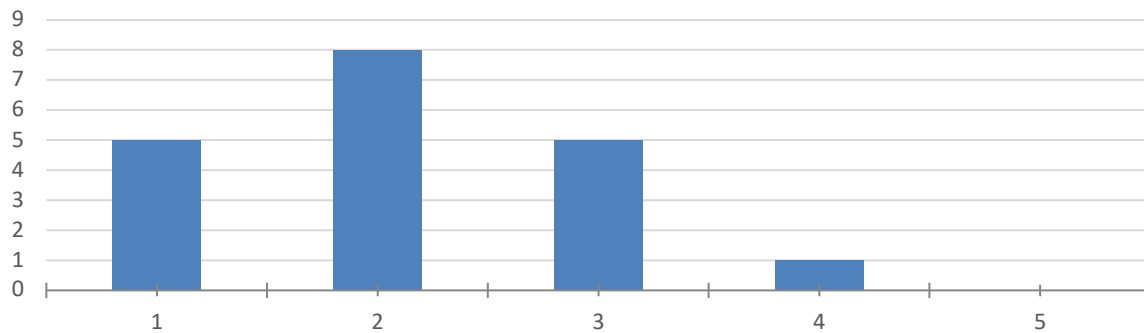
Club Survey Results – Rotary Club of Albert Park (March 2019)

1 = Strongly Disagree 2 = Disagree 3 = Neutral 4 = Agree 5 = Strongly Agree

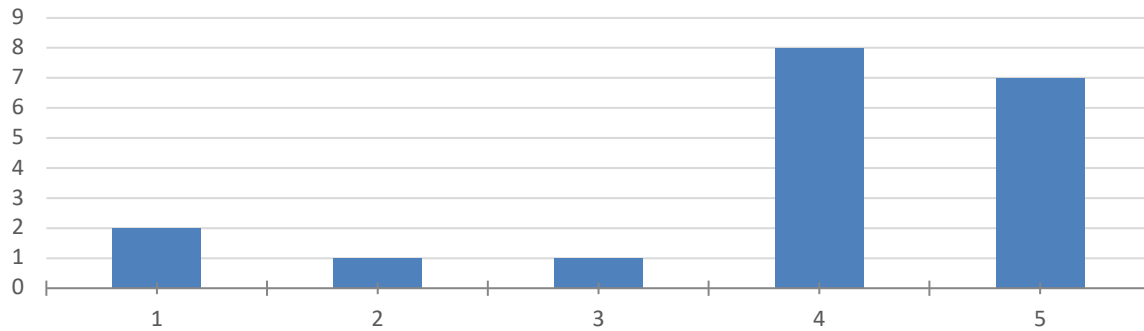
1. Membership orientation is consistently and regularly provided for new members



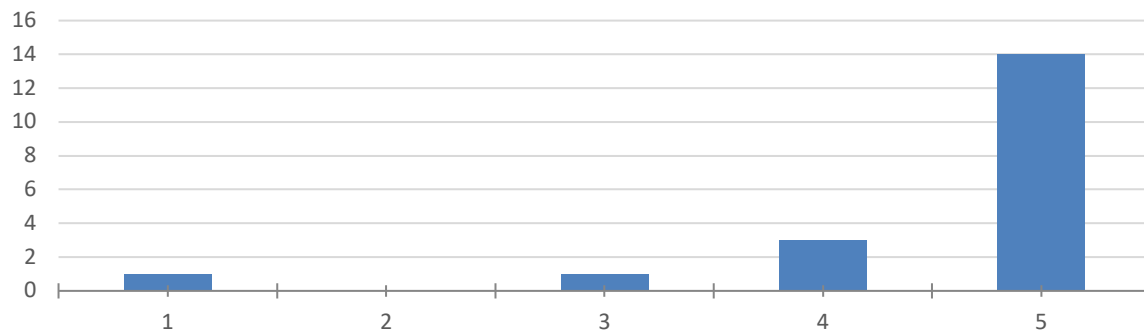
2. Our Club has a written plan for recruitment that all members are aware of.



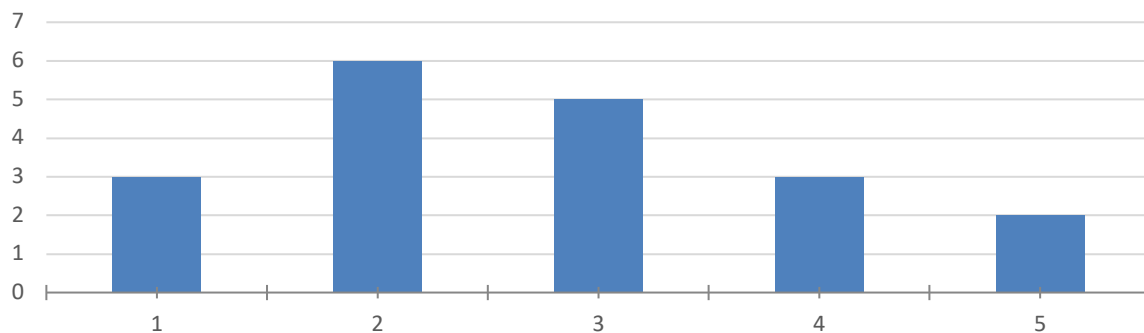
3. New members in our club are enrolled into a Club Committee within the first six weeks



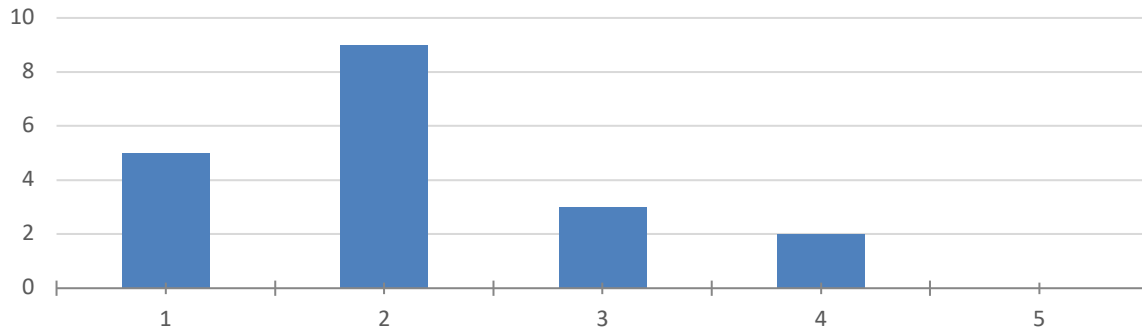

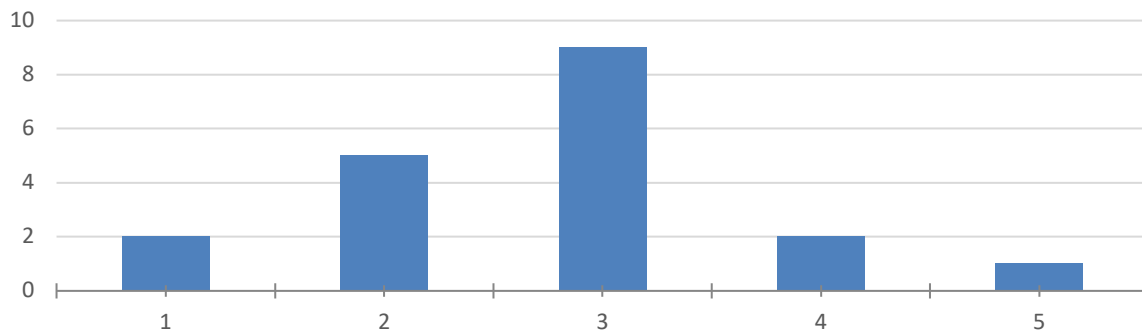
5. I think the number of members in our Club is adequate for its needs.



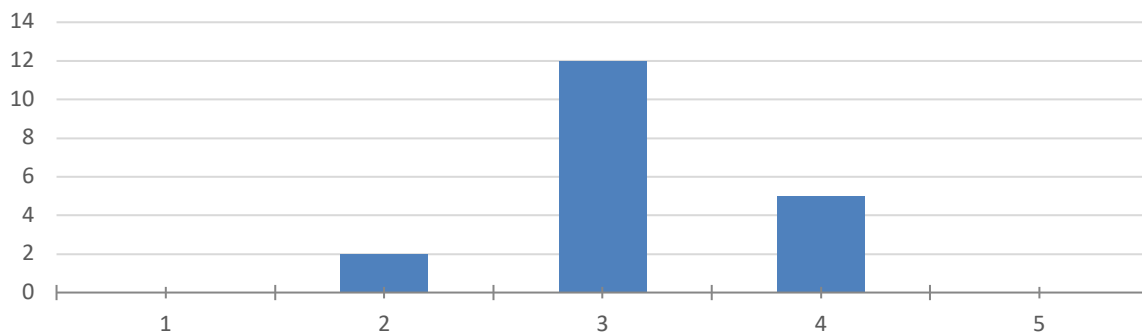

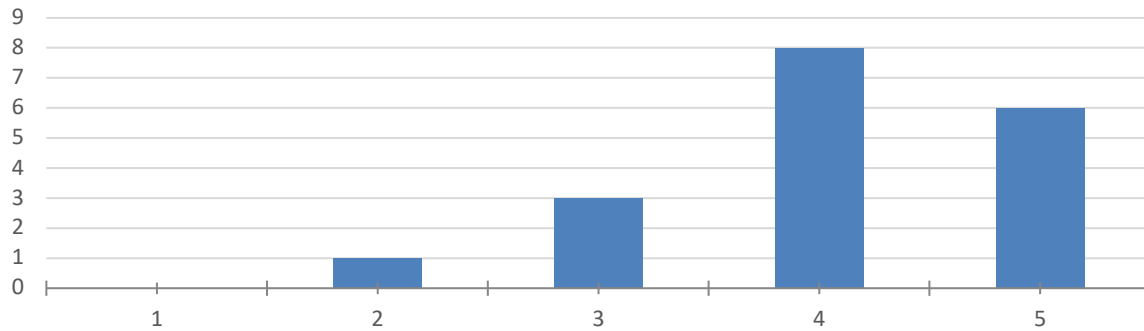
9. With an active fellowship program, camaraderie/fellowship is a hallmark of our club.



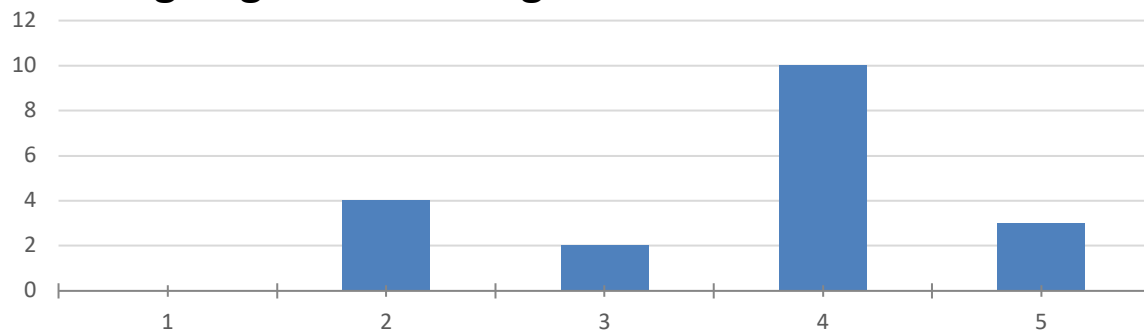

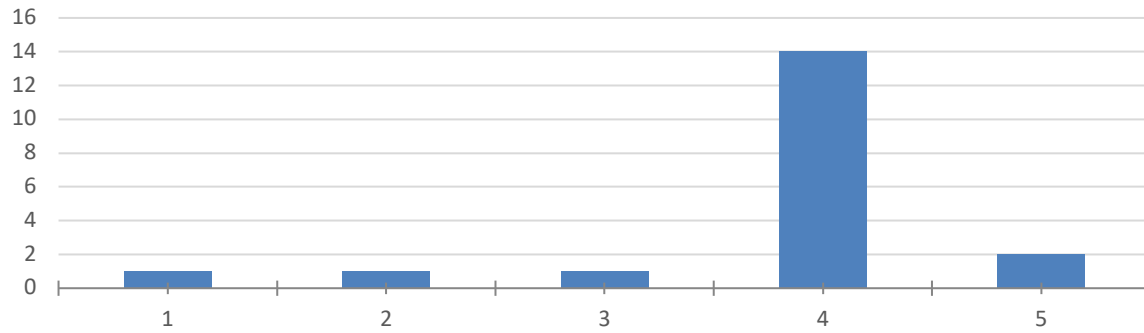

Need to ensure all members new and old are continuously updated or made aware of Rotary's membership commitments

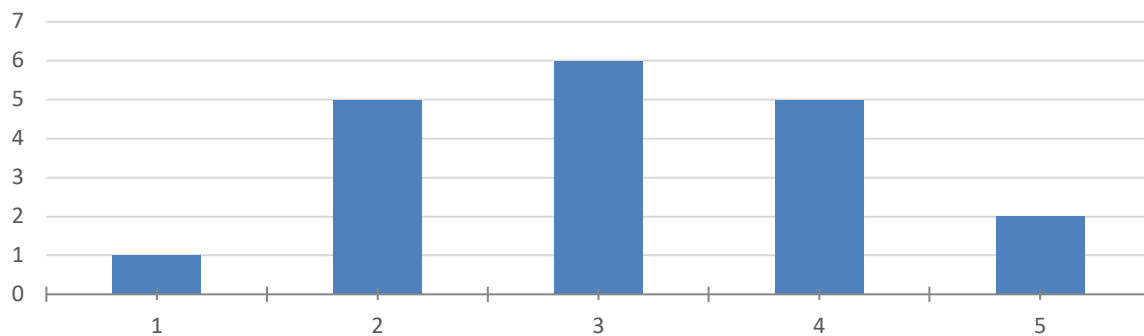
A lot of emphasis on getting new members with not enough attention in retaining existing members.

New memberships very successful in last two years.

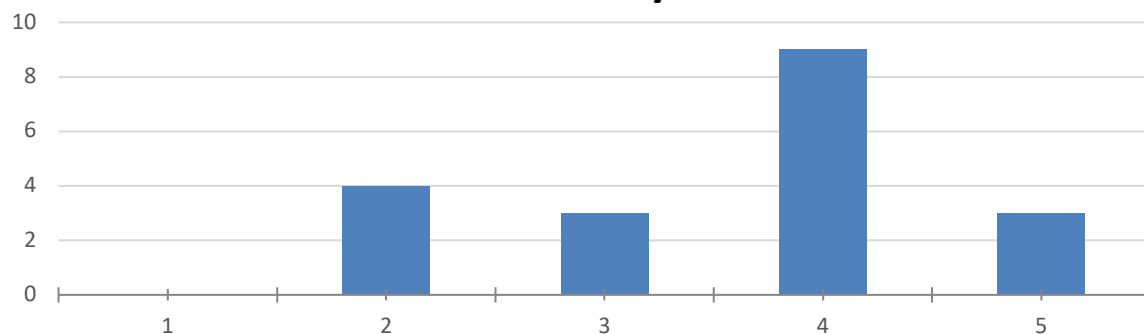

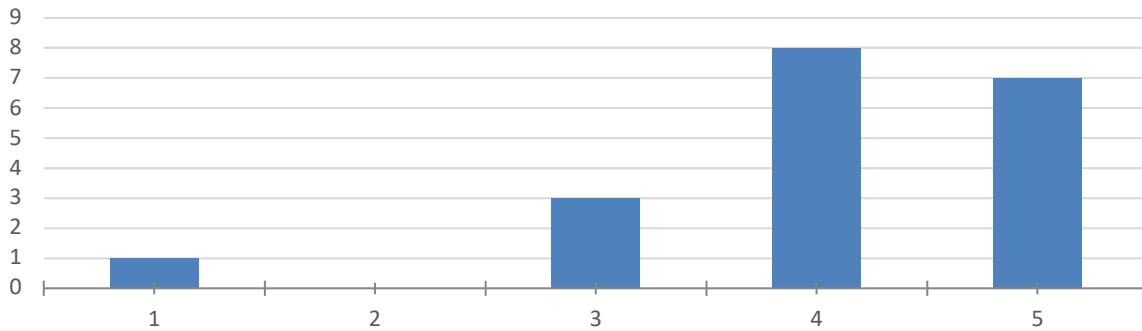
We do our best and all help out as best as they can on respective fund raisers

We raise and distribute money, but do not get actively involved.

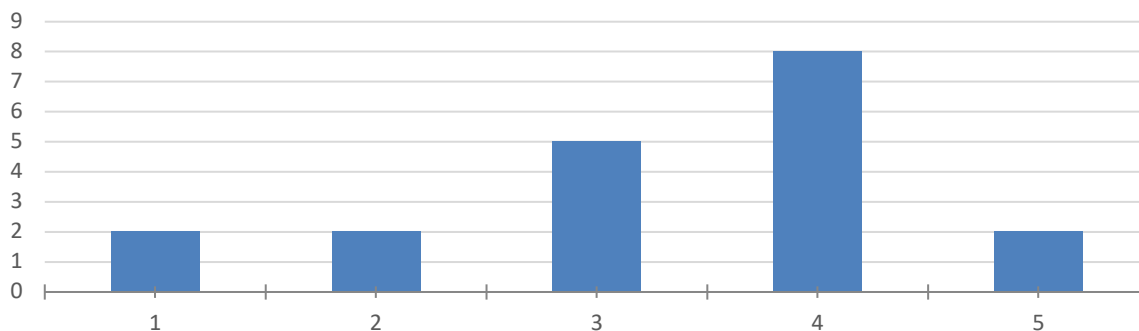
We do too much "giving of cheques" and not enough "hands on"

Targeting and gaining sponsorships and grants would greatly reduce the demand on the team to participate in so many fundraising activities.

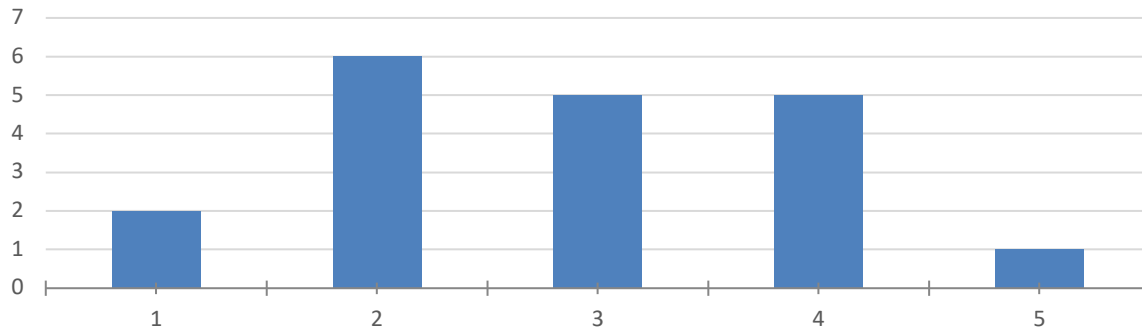

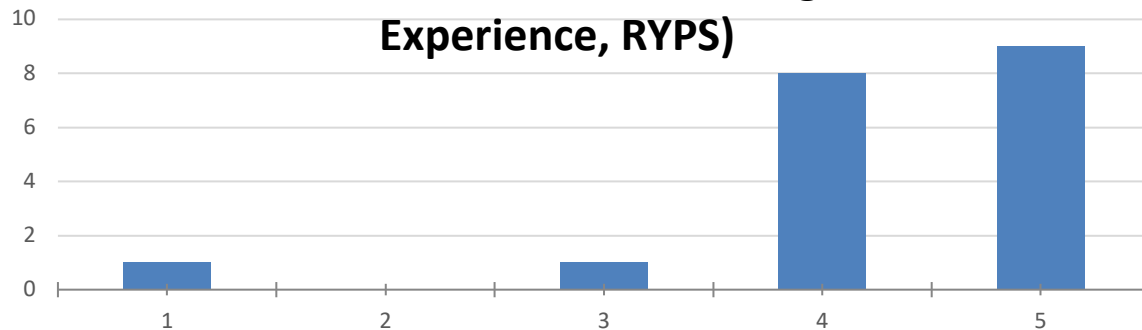


21. General Comments: Ideas and general comments you have regarding Vocational Service

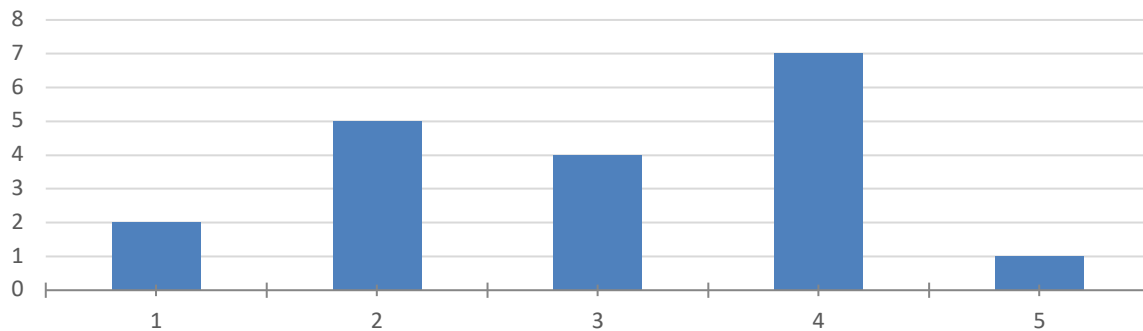
Only by sitting next to Jim do I know anything about what we do with the schools. I really enjoyed the presentation from the girls on their car project and then being able to follow them on facebook.

Our club doesn't know what vocational service is.

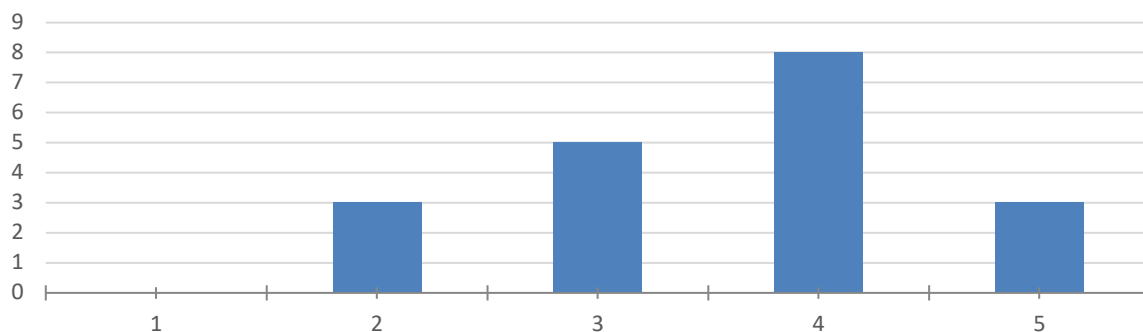

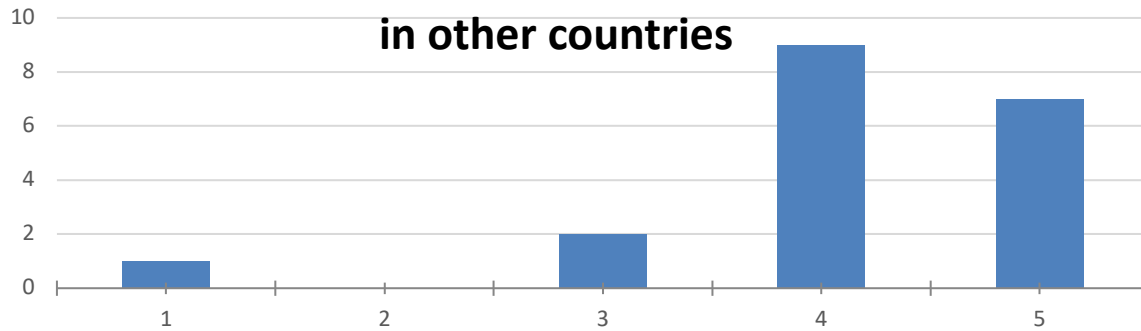

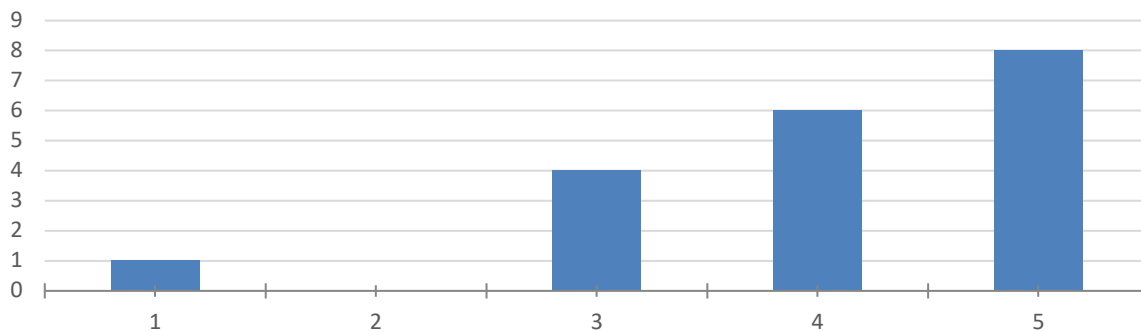

Again, I'm just not that exposed to this aspect of our club

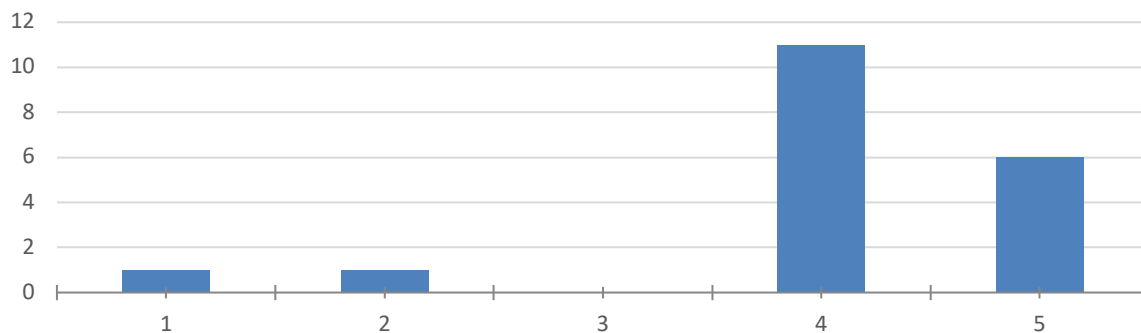

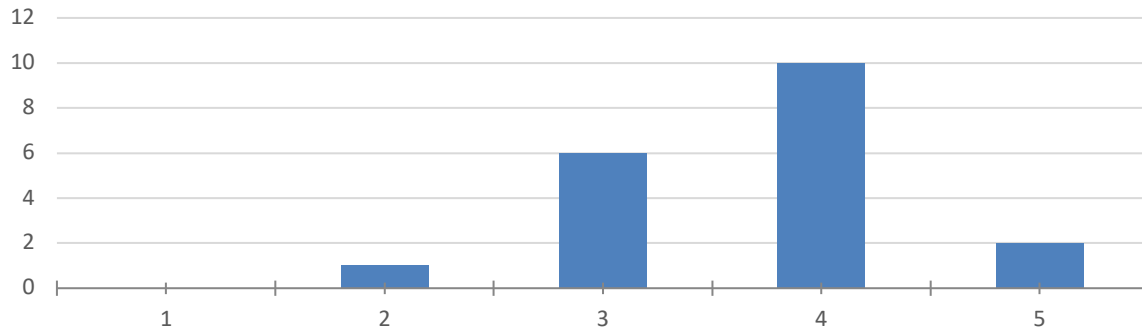
30. General Comments: Ideas and general comments you have regarding International Service

Has been good in last few years - need to diversify

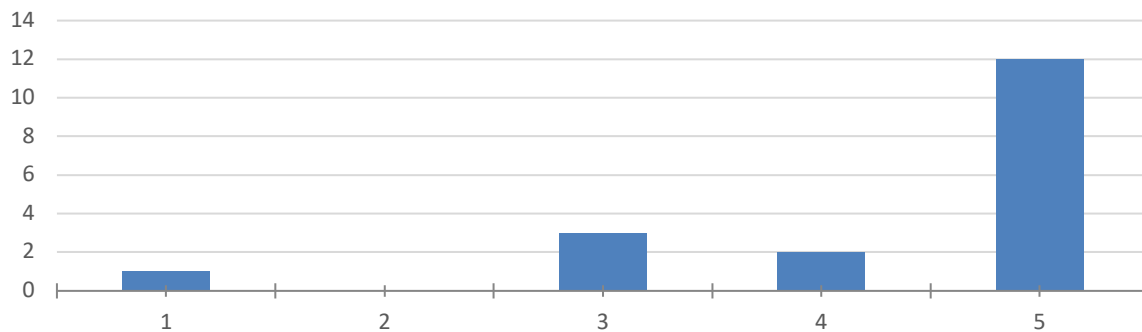

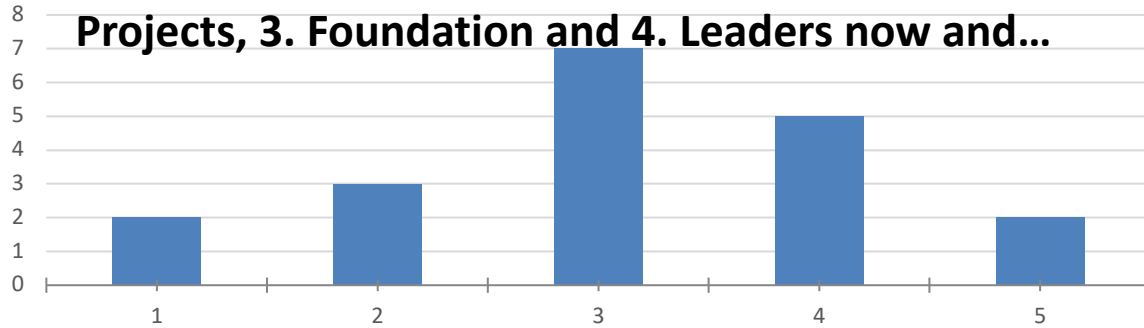
39. General Comments: Ideas and general comments you have regarding Fundraising

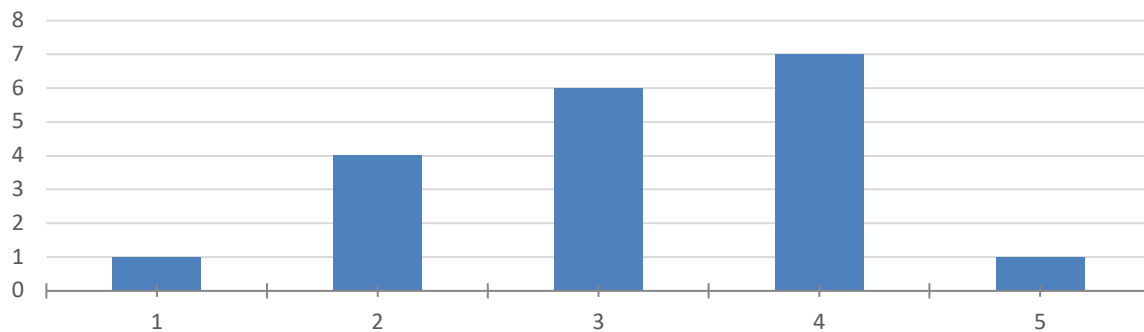
Need to diversify

We don't do very well - support isn't there from Rotary community because we don't support other clubs.

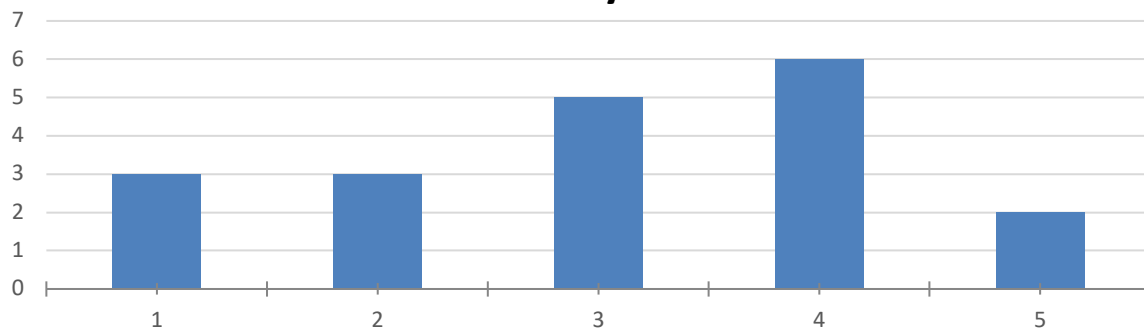

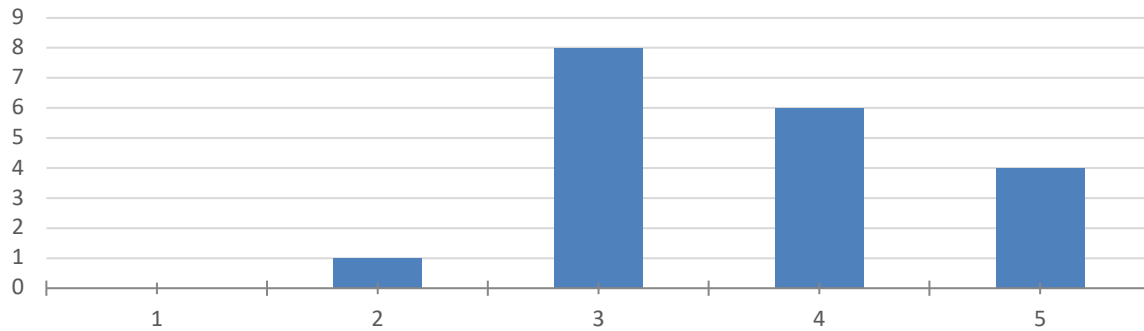

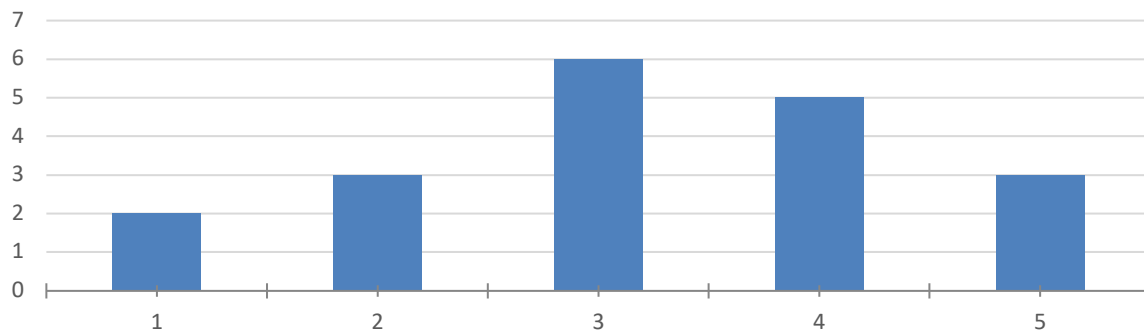

58. General Comments: Ideas and general comments you have regarding Communications and PR

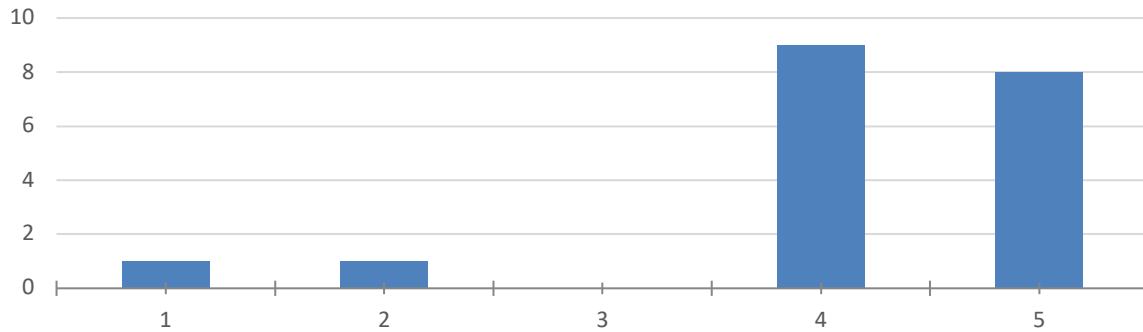

As before, need to advertise, along with (especially) District and Zone

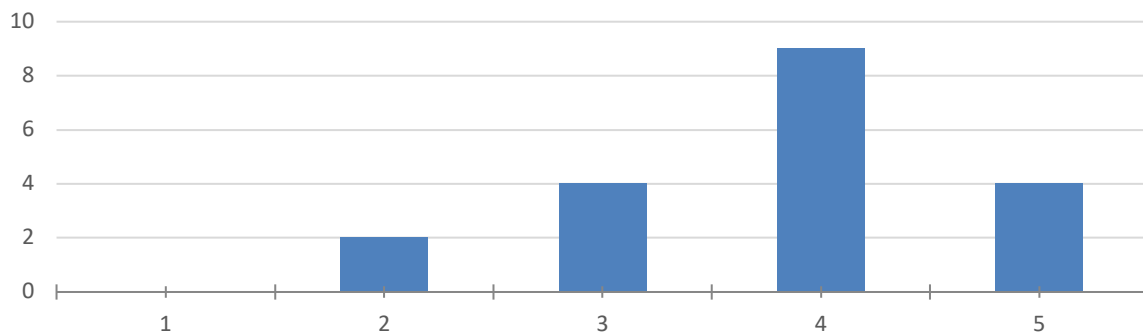
We have a relatively low level of interest/competency in social media within the club.
