ACTION/ACTIVITY	DATE
<i>Within 1 month:</i>	
Be inducted into club by Membership Chair, receive your New Member Packet and Membership Badge.	
Serve with sponsor or mentor as a Greeter (before start of meeting) or as “exit greeter” on the day of your induction into the club.	
Register and update your profile on the Club website. The website is www.fcbreakfastrotary.org . Your preliminary login ID will be sent to the email address in your application.	
Provide a photograph (headshot) for the club website by logging into ClubRunner and inserting a photo file in your member profile page	
Complete the biography form for our newsletter and Club Website	
Create a new account and fill out your profile on the Rotary International website at www.Rotary.org	
<i>Within 6 months:</i>	
Give your new member talk	
Attend a new member orientation meeting	
Attend 2 or more committee meetings/Join at least one committee	
Act as a Greeter one more time (2 times total)	
Attend a meeting of another Rotary Club	
Participate in a Rotary service project or fellowship event	
<i>Within 1 year:</i>	
Attend a Club Board Meeting	
Attend either a District Assembly (Spring and Fall) or the District Conference (early summer) or another Rotary Education opportunity
