

The Rotary Foundation is a non-profit organization that provides numerous international programs such as:

Polio Plus: The most ambitious program in Rotary's history, is the volunteer arm of the global partnership dedicated to eradicating polio. For more than 20 years, Rotary has led the private sector in the global effort to rid the world of this crippling disease. Today, PolioPlus and its role in the initiative is recognized worldwide as a model of public-private cooperation in pursuit of a humanitarian goal.

Group Study Exchange (GSE): This program is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for businesspeople and professionals between the ages of 25 and 40 who are in the early stages of their careers. The program provides travel grants for teams to exchange visits in paired areas of different countries. For four to six weeks, team members experience the host country's culture and institutions, observe how their vocations are practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

Matching Grants: Redding East Rotary has built medical and dental facilities in Gabon, Africa. Working with other local Rotary Clubs and the Foundation allows the club to help meet the needs of this impoverished area and to respond collectively.

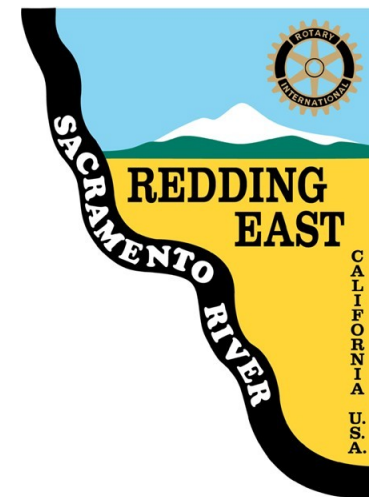

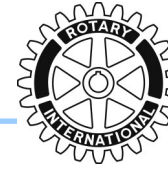
