District Grant Application due to District 7950 by Oct. 1, 2013

Global Grant Application – Apply online at www.rotaryinternational.org/ on a rolling basis

District Grants fund short term projects and activities, either local or international, that support the Foundation's mission.

Clubs submit their application to District 7950 which administers and distributes the funds.

- **Global Grants** fund large-scale projects and activities that (1) align with an area of focus (2) respond to a need the benefitting community has identified (3) includes active participation of Rotarians in benefitting community (4) are sustainable (4) have measureable results.

District Grant

- Supports the mission of The Rotary Foundation – humanitarian projects
- \$1,000 - \$6,000 for total project budget
- Short term impact
- Local or international projects – preference given to local projects
- Hands on meaningful participation of club members
- Can support scholars pursuing any level of study, locally or internationally
- Adheres to the Grant Terms & Conditions
- Project completed by June 30th
- Report and receipts submitted to District prior to reimbursement of funds

Global Grant

- Supports at least one of the Six Areas of Focus
- Minimum total project budget of \$30,000
- Long term – sustainable impact
- International project – involves 2 countries or an impoverished area of US
- Active Rotarian involvement
- Can support scholars pursuing graduate-level study internationally
- Adheres to the grant Terms and Conditions
- Project may take 2+ years to complete
- Funds granted after final approval by TRF
- Report due every 12 months and final report with receipts and bank statements due 2 months after completion of project.

Club Qualification:

- At least one (preferably two) club members attend a grants training seminar.
- Club has to be contributing to The Rotary Foundation (either in current or immediately preceding Rotary Year).
- Read, agree & sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Submit to district
- Read, agree & sign a District Memorandum – Submit to district.
