Through its PolioPlus program, Rotary International has contributed more than \$700 million over 25 years to support polio eradication efforts in priority countries.

Rotary started in 1905 in Chicago, Illinois, and is the world's oldest and largest service club. Currently there are more than 1.2 million members in 34,000 clubs located in 168 countries.

How to Become a Member

Contact Membership Chair Jeff Chapman at chapmanjef@umkc.edu. Prospective members are asked to attend several club meetings with a current member/sponsor in order to learn about the club, its members and activities. They are asked to supply information about their occupation and community activities. All membership applications must be approved by the club board and membership.

Members are asked to:

- Attend at least 50% of the weekly meetings.
- Be involved in club projects and service activities and serve on at least one club committee.
- Make a financial commitment of \$185/ quarter for meals and dues.
- Pay an induction fee of \$100. This is split between the Rotary International Foundation, which is matched by the club in the member's name, and the Plaza Rotary Foundation to support community projects and organizations.
