Program – Dee Coleman, Director, MACC Kirksville Higher Education Center

Dee Coleman described the educational programs offered at the Kirksville campus of Moberly Area Community College. Credits from associate degree programs at MACC transfer to Missouri colleges and universities that offer bachelors and advanced degrees. A popular collaboration is the TruMACC program that allows students to co-enroll at MACC and TSU. This provides students the opportunity to use A⁺ Program scholarships while enjoying the 4-year university experience. MACC offers dual-enrollment to KHS students that allows them to earn college credit while still enrolled in high school. Classes are offered on-campus, on-line, and in a hybrid format that combines traditional classroom learning with an on-line component. Daytime, evening, and intercession classes are available. Grant funding for new programs, *e.g.*, windfarm technician training, is being pursued.

Dee earned an Associate of Arts degree from MACC. She holds a bachelor's degree in Art Education from the University of Central Missouri, and masters and specialist degrees in education administration from William Woods University. Dee is currently enrolled in a doctorate of education in leadership program.
