#### **CLASSIFICATION TALK - CHADE SHORTEN**



Chade Shorten, a newer member of our club, is from the Macon/ Kirksville area. She is the proud daughter of fellow Rotary member Craig and his wife, Gina Shorten, who have operated the DuKum Inn for many years now. She said it seems to be a fun gathering place for Rotarians outside of our weekly meetings. Chade said she is still not sure what career path she will eventually go down but wanted to take us through the journey she has gone on so far and what has brought her here.

After attending school in Macon, Chade eventually moved to attend Kirksville High School, where she was a founding member of the Interact Club for her school. It was a great first introduction to

Rotary. She other members and traveled to Rotary clubs across North Missouri and talk about Interact and the benefits it would bring to their local high schools. She also attended RYLA in her sophomore year which was also a great experience.

After graduation, she attended Truman State University and majored in Communication. She enjoyed her time at Truman. There she was given opportunities to expand her education far outside the classroom. Two weeks into her senior year she received a phone call from a friend that a position had opened up on a political campaign in Reno, Nevada for which they thought she should apply. It was an extremely demanding experience but she was able to put the skills she had learned in the classroom to use and walked away from it having grown considerably in a professional sense.

Chade likes to call that her college sabbatical year, where she went out, found herself and came back to school. She finished up her senior year and graduated with a BA in Communication. After graduation she had a few different job offers but wasn't quite ready to leave Kirksville yet. She currently manages the nightclub WrongDaddys where she is in charge of the day-to-day operations that keep the place running and calling her dad when something is broken that she doesn't know how to fix. Right now she loves working for her parents and learning all the wisdom that they have acquired from owning their own small businesses over the years.
