OPEN WORLD PROGRAM: CLIMATE SMART AGRICULTURE -AZERBAIJAN TO MID-MISSOURI

We were pleased to have Kit Freudenberg, a Jefferson City Rotarian, present our program today. In Dale's introduction we learned that Kit's work experiences have been in the conservation and museum fields including work at the National Churchill Museum at Westminster College in Fulton, Missouri. In the U.S. Army, she served as an Order of Battle Specialist Intelligence Analyst. She has lived in 11 states and three foreign countries. She also served in the

British Army. Kit and her husband will co-chair the District 6080 Friendship Exchange with Taiwan in 2021. She has been actively involved in several Rotary activities, including this Open World event with Azerbaijan, a post-Soviet union nation which has Iran as its southern neighbor.

The Open World Program is a partnership between Rotary International and Congress to provide post-Soviet union countries an intensive program related to their profession and give the delegates a first-hand look at American Free Enterprise. This eight-day (32 hour) program on agriculture, hosted by Jefferson City's four Rotary clubs, was held October 1-9, 2019. There were six delegates from Azerbaijan plus an interpreter (pictured below at a Lt. Gov. Mike Kehoe breakfast). Kit showed us a PowerPoint about the program which included

photos of places the delegation visited during their visit. She said it was a great experience and encouraged us to participate in the future. She said to check Rotary International - Open World Program for programs for 2021. She said to check the grant for deadlines and budget. (They had a \$3,900 budget.) Gather a team and select a topic and dates. Brainstorm ideas for 32 hours of programming over eight days. Plan some fun. Write a proposal and see where it goes!
