TSU PRESIDENT SUE THOMAS was introduced by Marie Murphree (see bio attached to cover email). Dr. Thomas spoke about how happy students are to be back in Kirksville after being away since March. (She said a "Love, Kirksville" video has received almost 100,000 views!) She spoke about Covid-19 precautions and being part of a masking campaign. They have produced stickers with masked mascots which are very popular with students. She said Truman has 11 active cases, far fewer than other Missouri schools. She spoke about 14-day quarantines and isolation of positive cases (most opt to go home). Dr. Thomas spoke

of the new Truman logo (and a new bulldog logo pictured) and about marketing being stepped up. A selling point is Truman is #1 for public colleges in MO for job placement and #7 in the country!) She said the Greenwood building exterior improvements include window replacement and painting as well as a new parking lot. The Sunderland Foundation out of Kansas City, MO is the grantor of a \$1.1M gift specifically for renovation of the Greenwood building. Dr. Thomas said the budget cut announced on July 1 is \$5.2M again this year but Truman is alive and well and will be for years to come! (Dr. Thomas said she still has new logo t-shirts.
