MARTIN STITZER, SPARKLIGHT GENERAL MANAGER/ENGINEER: A lifelong Kirksville native and Thousand Hills Rotarian, Martin has worked for CableOne/Sparklight for 30 years. He spoke today about the awesome project they have been doing for the last two years which they hope to complete by the beginning of the second quarter of 2021, ahead of the anticipated four years. It involves in-ground coax cables combined with fiber-optic technology, providing hybrid fiber and coaxial connections. He said there will be 160 miles of cable in the ground. This will be the first system completed within CableOne, Inc., of which Sparklight is still a part. (Matt Eichor introduced the speaker today.)
