**JEFF ROMINE ON THE ROTARY FOUNDATION**: Jeff spoke about this highly rated charity today and its mission. He described Rotary's seven areas of focus. He spoke specifically about the Annual Programs Fund, to which our members donated \$14,537 in 2019-20. (We also gave \$10,917 to PolioPlus in 2019-20 and were #1 in District 6040.) Fifty one of us gave that year, 35 to the Annual Fund and 43 to Polio Plus (although many gave to both). The District's goal for 2019-20 was \$144/each but our average giving was \$191. He showed us the various recognition items awarded, including major donor pins and Paul Harris Society pins with ribbons. He also spoke about Endowment Fund Bequests through wills, living trusts, or life insurance and beneficiary assignment of an investment including IRAs. We currently have six known benefactors in our club and four known Bequest Society members. A Credit Card program is also included within the Endowment

Fund categories. Jeff encourages us to give generously if we can. See Rotary Direct form attached to cover email. An interesting fact: Of \$3 billion donated worldwide over the last 100+ years, our club donated \$345,586 (over 1/3 of a million).
