MARK TWAIN BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROGRAM: Dale Schenewerk introduced Vice President of Clinical Operations Angela Caraway who will be celebrating 25 years of service this summer. (She informed Dale that her daughter Samantha, an ATSU employee, was a Rotary scholarship recipient seven years ago.)

Mark Twain Behavioral Health is a private, not-for-profit Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic which has been serving nine northeast Missouri counties since 1975. It currently has 175 team members and has offices in Hannibal, Kirksville and Macon. Its mission is to enhance the overall health and wellbeing of those they serve in many areas including Access Crisis Intervention, serving as Community Mental Health Liaison, and Community Psychiatric Rehabilitation through Healthcare Home, Integrated Treatment for Co-Occurring Disorders and Psychosocial Rehabilitation, as well as other services including School-based Therapy. Mark Twain is also involved with Show Me Hope Missouri which is providing



individual, family and group outreach to citizens impacted by COVID-19, working through various organizations. She said the Adair County Health Department has been doing a particularly great job during the pandemic. She announced that Mark Twain received a \$3.4M grant which will allow them to add 10 staff members and increase youth services. Also, she previewed for us the new construction project which will be named in honor of the late Pat Murdock, a Thousand Hills Rotarian and their former leader. Angela invited us to attend an open house on May 18.
