

PARK COMMITTEE MEETING, THURSDAY, JUNE 10, 5:15 PM, LOWER SHELTER HOUSE

Mark Burger said all are welcome.

ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION UPDATE: Commissioner Mark Shahan reported on three major projects (1) The April ballot measure passed for a 1/4% sales tax, for the Courthouse Restoration (expected to generate \$900,000/year); (2) City/County agreement on the Hungry Hollow Road project; and (3) \$4.9 million Federal American Rescue funds.



Commissioner Shahan said the **Courthouse Restoration** is slow going. He had his first meeting with the St. Louis firm they hired this morning. Exterior work will be addressed first, before any interior work is done. (An elevator project, however, is proceeding.) Composite shingles were ordered today before the price increased. Cost of materials has more than doubled recently. The Historical Preservation Committee approved the roof project. An ownership agreement was signed with the City on the **Hungry Hollow Road** project, which establishes that the County owns the road. Three tubes will be removed and a 50-foot long clear-span bridge will be built which will have eye beams and guard rails. The City is providing \$69,000 and the County will do the rest, building the bridge with help from contractors. **\$4.9 million Federal American Rescue** funds are available to the county to address economic fallout from the pandemic, which would include infrastructure improvements including water and sewer. Mark said, although the City oversees such projects, there is potential for assistance to the rural water district. The Commission needs to decide how we could spend the money. Mark started discussion of the application process today; once approved they would receive half the funds and then the remainder after one year. **Other Matters:** In response to Ron Gaber's question, Mark said improvements are planned for Potter Trail this summer, although it won't be asphalt. Mark said bonus funds have been provided by Ameren to fix roads leading to the wind farms.
