

This group is part of AVENUES FOR NORTHEAST MISSOURI, INC. which operates out of Hannibal, serving 11 northeast Missouri counties. The group came to Adair, Schuyler and Scotland counties during the pandemic, opening an office in Kirksville at 2301 S. Franklin on June 4, 2021. Their hope is to open a shelter here within the next year or so. Grants must be written to
