MACC UPDATE: DR. DEE (MOTTER) COLEMAN: In Dale’s introduction we learned that our speaker was born and raised in Adair County, attending high school in Novinger. She holds degrees from MACC (AA), University of Central Missouri (BA) and Masters, Specialist and Doctorate in Education Leadership degrees from William Woods. She taught art in grades K-12 for seven years, the last five in Atlanta, MO. She returned to MACC in Kirksville as the Assistant Director before starting as the site director in 2018. She and her husband live on a farm in Callao, along with their two daughters.

Dr. Coleman said MACC has five campuses plus an on-line campus. Many of their students earn AA degrees before going on to four-year colleges. MACC is one of the largest dual-credit providing community colleges in the state, with Kirksville being one of the top two high schools. This allows students to earn AA degrees while still in high school. She said they are adding softball and baseball to sports this fall. Working with Carolyn Chrisman they obtained a grant for offering wind farm and mechatronics certificate programs. They were able to set up a lab. Students attend classes all day on Wednesdays and are required to pass a college-level math course. MACC has helped with Kraft training and provided two classrooms all summer long at no cost for the new call center to train employees.
