## THOUSAND HILLS STATE PARK SUPERINTENDENT RYAN PERSINGER

In Ramey Weichelt's introduction we learned that Ryan Persinger, who holds a Wildlife Conservation degree from Missouri Western State University, has been with the State Park system for 13 years and park superintendent here since 2018.

Ryan said the Thousand Hills State Park, which opened in 1952, covers over 3,000 acres, with Forest Lake at just under 600 acres. They have around 14 miles of trails. The State Park, operated by a full time staff of six, had just under 550,000 visitors in 2022. Recent accomplishments include installing a deck at the dining lodge in 2018, seawall concrete docks in 2019, a new park office in 2021 (after earlier office destroyed in a 2016 fire); a paved trail between

Campgrounds #1 and #2 in 2022; and, last winter and spring the exhaust system at the dining lodge was redone. Future plans include an auto gate will be installed at the entrance (10 pm to 6 am) with codes supplied for afterhours entrance. (Vandalism has been a problem.) Wastewater stations will be updated this winter and a four-mile dirt trail between Campground #1 to the end of Michigan Street will be opened in 2024. One year from now the beach change house will be redone making ADA accessible. A big change: The Kolb family did not bid on a new 10-year concessions contract. Starting in 2024, a hospitality management company called ExplorUS will add our state park concessions to its several other concessions. Ryan said, in promoting the Dark Skys program, over 20 more light fixtures will be replaced with amber fixtures. More Dark Skys programs with TSU and the Adair Co Public Library will be scheduled. Upcoming Events: September 23, Archeology Day at the petroglyphs, and on September 30, the FLATS half marathon will be held. The speaker is pictured above with Rotarian Ramey Weichelt.
