HOSPICE OF NORTHEAST MISSOURI: Matt Eichor introduced Heidi Templeton who is the development coordinator for Hospice of Northeast Missouri, a position she has held since 2022. Her primary responsibility is to assist in getting the word out about the services Hospice provides in a ten county region. She has a BA from the University of Missouri-Columbia in Speech Communications with Honor and a BA in Political Science. Heidi served as the director of public relations at Truman State University for over 28 years before retiring in 2019.



Heidi said Hospice of Northeast Missouri is celebrating its 30th anniversary with a ribbon cutting on November 8 at 11 am. It will be held at Alliant Bank where Hospice has an office in the basement. Ron Gaber was instrumental in the formation of Hospice 2000 in 1994. ATSU/KCOM donated its first office space. Jeff Romine was its first treasurer. Hospice 2000, with its 13 members, operated with a half million dollar grant, which was supported by over 100 community members. The goal at that time was to reach 50 patients; now they reach over 200 patients per year in ten counties. In 2004 David Nichols was instrumental in the name change to Hospice of Northeast Missouri. Hospice has also had the support of Debi Boughton, Shari Schenewerk and Sherry Lamberson.

Heidi introduced Lisa Bunch who serves as volunteer and development coordinator. Lisa spoke about the need for volunteers who serve directly with patients or indirectly helping in the office.
