STEP-UP ANTI-BULLYING PROGRAM

Rotarian Angie Sullivan gave a presentation on the Step-Up anti-bullying program currently supported by a District Grant awarded to the Rotary Club of Kirksville. Six 4th grade girls have been chosen to participate in the Sisterhood, two girls each in the categories of bully, target, and witness. Angie meets with the girls every Friday during their lunch hour without knowing which girls belong to which category. The girls write about their feelings in their journals, make drawings, read poems, and work through the additional activities in their spirals. One required activity is to interview an adult in the community about their own experience as a bully or target, and then to discuss that interview with the other girls in the Step-Up Sisterhood. During Week 9, girls who complete the program will go through a graduation ceremony. Angie has received much positive feedback from the girls, counselors, and teachers at Ray Miller, and has received reports that the girls are educating members of their own families about bullying! Angie is Special Projects Coordinator at CAPNEMO. She and her husband Jeremy are the proud parents of Shad, Ashtyn, and Nevaeh.
