FEBRUARY IS PEACE BUILDING AND CONFLICT PREVENTION MONTH.

JOHN FABSITS ON SCOUTING AMERICA: We were happy to have John, a fellow Rotarian (center), from Columbia MO speak with us today. He serves as scout executive/CEO of Scouting America, Great Rivers Council. John was accompanied today by another Rotarian, Scouting America District Director Rob Townsend (left) from Centralia, MO. The speaker was introduced by Matt Eichor, pictured on the right.

John shared some interesting statistics about **Scouting America** (new name as of last year): Over one million youth are served by Scouting America programs annually. Among this number are over 175,000 girls and young women. Adult leaders who volunteer their time and talent number 475,000. There are over 200 councils serving local communities. Scouts earned 1.3 million merit badges. Eagle Scouts number 30,000. Hours of service donated back to our communities: 7.1 million.



John also provided statistics about the **Great Rivers Council**: 2,439 youth served and 1,257 adult volunteers (Membership has grown in 2024). The youths are 79% male and 21% female. (Females were first welcomed in 2019). Within 142 Scouting Units. 2,967 merit badges were earned. Great Rivers Council has 75 Eagle Scouts and 2,248 service projects. Tuition assistance at William Woods University and Missouri Valley College is a perk available to Eagle Scouts. He spoke about two facilities - Scouting Adventure Center in Columbia and the Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservation which provides high tech experiences in addition to outdoor activities.
