The company, a family owned and operated business, provides quality used automotive transmission parts as well as transmission cores obtained from salvage yards. Their customer base is comprised of transmission re-manufacturing facilities as well as transmission shops.

In 2009 Trevor, interested in transmissions since age 12, opened his first business in Lawson, Missouri. In 2014 he merged with a company in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, forming Global Transmission Parts, Inc. A year later he bought out his partners and became the sole owner. After four years, he made the strategic decision to relocate the business to Kirksville which was closer to home. The move was made in November 2020. Since then, the company quickly outgrew its Industrial Road location near Cable Street and expanded into the much larger former 150,000 square feet Hollister building, which Trevor purchased.
