
FOOD BANK DONATIONS! Debi said we donated 45 boxes of cereal today.

DANNY PAGLIAI ON ROTARY PARK PROJECTS (INCLUDING TREE PROJECT): Danny said some past projects included purchasing tables and chairs for the amphitheater, painting the amphitheater backdrop black, installing a plaque on west wall celebrating 100 years of Rotary Leadership - Past Club Presidents, installed four memorial benches, purchased a cement corn hole game, moved the Baldwin Memorial to the west side of the bridge and landscaped and rocked the area, planted four trees near the Baldwin Memorial and the main shelter, mulched trees around the park and worked on landscaping around the park entrance sign. All projects were in conjunction with the City of Kirksville with whom we have a positive relationship. We have had great participation with our projects, including from ATSU Rotaract.
