#### Highlights of the Rotary Club of Lee's Summit Doers:

- Continues to participate in the "Shoes for Orphan Souls" program with more than 15,000 pairs donated to date
- Hosts annual fundraisers including golf tournament & Valentine's gala benefitting non profit charities
- Provides more than \$7,000 annually for scholarships to local students attending community colleges through local endowment
- Purchased a gazebo for Legacy Park, worth more than \$30,000
- Participated in a project to provide a school bus costing more than \$20,000 for deaf and disabled children in Nagpur, India
- Participated in a Water Well project to provide clean water for a community in Thailand
- Annually provides funding and manpower for the Rotary Youth Camp serving children with disabilities in the Kansas City metropolitan area

- Annually funds two boys to attend Missouri Boys State and two girls to attend Missouri Girls State
- Purchased 12 shelter boxes with each box including emergency equipment and housing for a family to live for up to six months
- Houses and provides funding for the Rotary Youth Exchange from a foreign country
- Provided 600 Water Pasteurization Instruments to the village of San Mateo, Mexico, 1,000 to villages throughout Jamaica and 500 to a local non-profit organization to distribute to third-world countries Supports Special Olympics through Polar Bear Plunge
- Participates in the Lee's Summit R-7 School District Adopt-A-Family program helping local families in need
- Launched Lee's Summit Adopt-A-Road Project (3rd Street, Pryor to View High)
