- Economic and community development





What is Centerville Rotary?

Centerville Rotary is comprised of South Dayton government leaders, professionals, business owners and retirees who care about local and community issues and who enthusiastically share their expertise to address those issues. Centerville Rotary is the coming together of friends for the common good and distributes over \$30,000 annually for international and local service projects.

Recent international support went to the eradication of polio; and borehole water pump projects in Africa.

In the past, local support built a gazebo at Benham's Grove, a shelter at Oak Grove Park, a memorial garden and evergreen forest at Grant Park and a walkway and a Little Free Library at Schoolhouse and Iron Horse Parks.

Annually, the club awards six to eight scholarships to high school seniors plus distributes dictionaries to all 3rd graders and thesauri to all 5th graders in the local schools. Recent club grants have purchased 2460 coats for Hannah's Treasure Chest, built steps at The Castle, provided food for children year round, sent Blue Star Mothers holiday stockings to the troops, helped the VA Center fund a new grotto garden, and helped students advance their education through College Promise. This past year club financial support also went to the Americana Festival, BOGG Ministries, Brunner Literacy Center, Brigid's Path, Centerville-Washington Diversity Council Martin Luther King Breakfast, and the Centerville High School Interact Club clean water initiative and Spirit Chain. But Centerville Rotary doesn't just give money. Recently, the sweat equity of members went into serving meals at House of Bread, mulching gardens at Grant Park, packing groceries at St. Vincent de Paul, sorting books for Project Read and providing collection boxes and household books for Habitat for Humanity. The club also sponsored high school students at a leadership training weekend and Rotary District speech contest, and hosted an exchange student from Peru, Rodrigo Fernando Granica Tinajeros.

As Rotarian Clem Renouf said, "Rotary takes ordinary men and gives them extraordinary opportunities to do more with their lives than they ever dreamed possible."

Centerville Rotary Club women and men prove this every day.
