2020 Community Service Scholarship

The Cranston Rotary Club Community Service Scholarship Grant was established to assist graduating seniors from each of the four Cranston area high schools to pursue a two or four year collegiate degree. This year, one senior from Cranston High School East, Cranston High School West, the Cranston Area Career & Technical Center and NEL/CPS Construction and Career Academy will be eligible to receive a Cranston Rotary Club Community Service Scholarship provided they meet the criteria outlined below.

Criteria:

Applications will not be accepted unless all criteria are met and included in the application.

1. Verification of at least a 3.0 overall GPA from your guidance counselor.
2. A copy of the acceptance letter from the school you plan to attend.
3. A letter of verification of community service hours and description of the role performed from the community service provider. A minimum of 40 hours of community service in your junior and senior year (a portion of these hours may be fulfilled the summer preceding your junior or senior year).
4. Two letters of recommendation (one from your guidance counselor & one from your community service organization).
5. An essay about one of your most positive service-oriented experiences during your HS years.

*Please include in your essay how your experience aligns with the beliefs and areas of focus of Rotary International. We have identified specific causes to target to maximize our local and global impact. At the same time, we understand that each community has its own unique needs and concerns.
