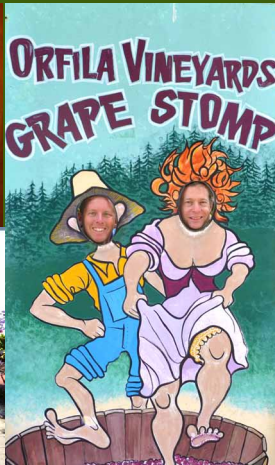


## ROAD RALLY 2014

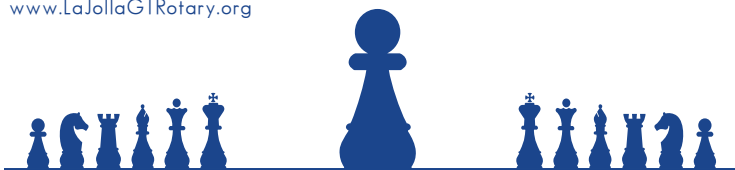

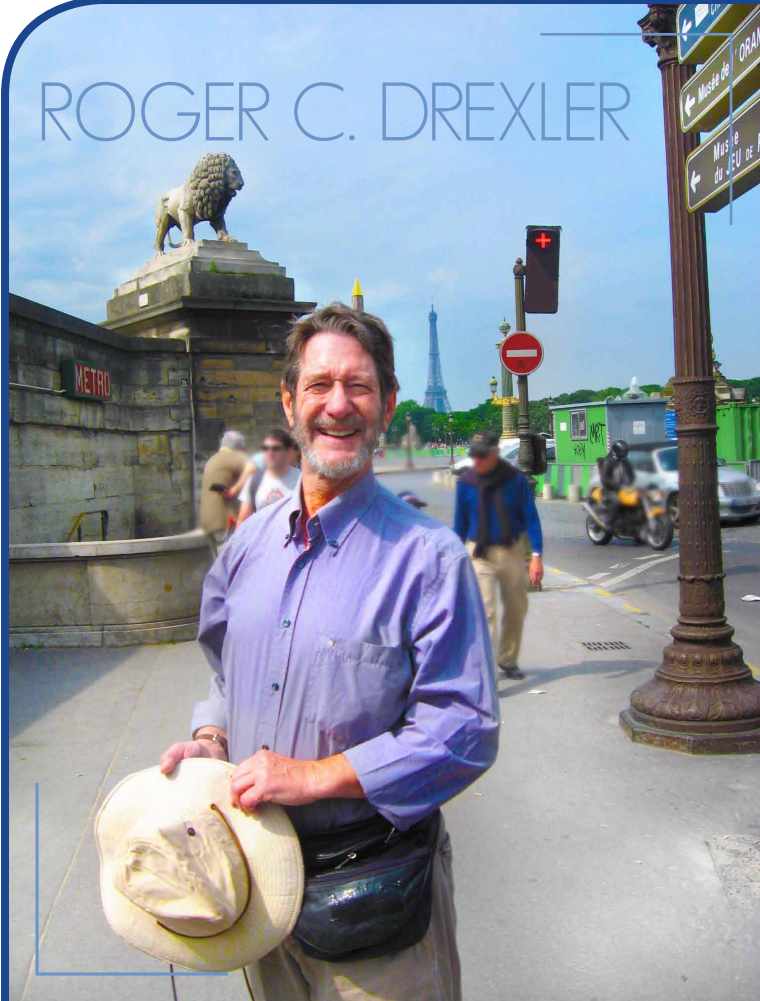

## ROGER C. DREXLER
