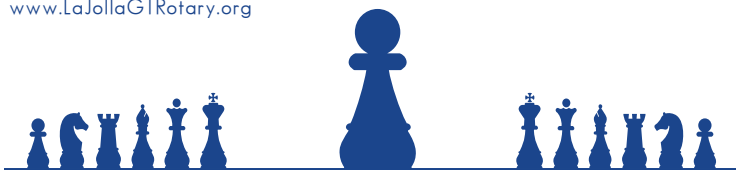

After retiring, I incorporated and consulted for Salk until their new development team was in place. I continue to consult for two large foundations, one in California and one in Colorado who fund not only scientific research but also a variety of other very worthwhile causes.

Brad and I are members of the San Diego Country Club where I have served on the board. I am past captain of our Winter Cup Team, past president of the Women's Golf Association and currently chair the

Social Committee (right up my alley), and chair of the Marketing and Fundraising Committee for the 2017 USGA Women's Amateur Championship that is being held at the San Diego Country Club.

When I'm not golfing, or trying to be a good Rotarian, Brad and I are enjoying more travel, adding more wine to our cellar, and spending more time in our kitchen.

Born and raised in Vancouver, B.C., we spend a fair amount of time with my family there specifically with seven adorable grand nieces and nephews.
