



After retiring, I incorporated and consulted for Salk until their new development team was in place. I continue to consult for two large foundations, one in California and one in Colorado who fund not only scientific research but also a variety of other very worthwhile causes.

Brad and I are members of the San Diego Country Club where I have served on the board. I am past captain of our Winter Cup Team, past president of the Women's Golf Association and currently chair the Social
