



Marty Rosenstein brought our Student of the Month from Preuss, Lauren Salerno, who is captain of her volleyball team and had an awakening upon receiving a "D" in an AP class.

Steve Brown introduced photographer John Rowe, a retired gaming software entrepreneur, member of the Explorers

Club, and founder of nonprofit Omo Child. In the remote Omo Valley region of Southwest Ethiopia, Mingi is the ritualistic killing of infants and children believed to be cursed. Reasons for these killings include children born out of wedlock, children whose teeth first develop on their upper jaw rather than lower, and children whose mothers' missed a particular blessing from the tribal elders. Omo Child is currently rescuing 43 children from Mingi in its small home in the region, and has been successful at ending Mingi in at least one village. John's commitment to the people in the Omo Valley combined with the courage, wisdom, and conviction of his guide Lale Biwa, have brought dramatic change in these communities.


