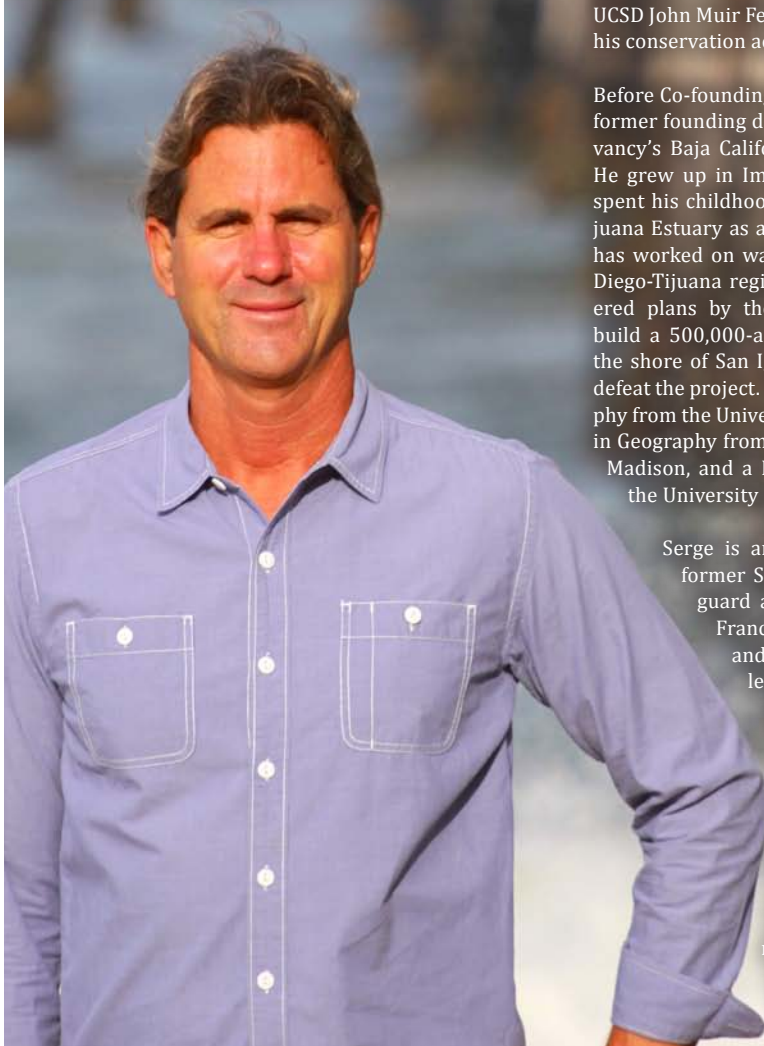

Serge Dedina, Ph.D
Executive Director



As the Co-founder and Executive Director of WILDCOAST, Serge has helped to preserve more than three million acres of coastal and marine ecosystems since 2000.

In received the 2009 San Diego Zoological Society's Conservation Medal as well as the California Coastal Commission's "Coastal Hero" Award. In 2003, he received the Surf Industry's Environmental Award in recognition of his role in helping defeat the Mexican government's Nautical Ladder mega-marina plan. He was named a UCSD John Muir Fellow in 2013 in recognition of his conservation achievements.

Before Co-founding **WILDCOAST**, Serge was the former founding director of The Nature Conservancy's Baja California-Sea of Cortez Program. He grew up in Imperial Beach, California, and spent his childhood helping to preserve the Tijuana Estuary as a National Wildlife Refuge. He has worked on water quality issues in the San Diego-Tijuana region since 1980. Serge discovered plans by the Mitsubishi Corporation to build a 500,000-acre industrial salt facility on the shore of San Ignacio Lagoon and helped to defeat the project. He received a Ph.D. in Geography from the University of Texas at Austin, a M.S. in Geography from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and a B.A. in Political Science from the University of California, San Diego.

Serge is an avid surfer, swimmer, and former State of California Ocean Life-guard and has lived and studied in France, Spain, El Salvador, Mexico, and Peru. He spends most of his leisure time surfing and camping with his family. Serge is the author of *Saving the Gray Whale*, a book based on the three years he lived in the gray whale lagoons of Baja California, and *Wild Sea: Eco-Wars and Surf Stories from the Coast of the Californias*. His new book, *Surfing the Border*, will be released in the fall of 2014.

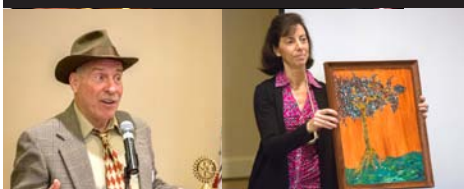

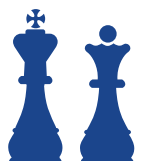
