Tom Seidler enters his second full season as a member of the Padres ownership group.

Seidler moved to San Diego from Visalia, where he spent the previous six years operating the Visalia Rawhide minor league club in the Advanced-A, California League. Seidler served as President and General Manager of the franchise, overseeing ballpark renovations and unprecedented attendance growth. Under Seidler's leadership, the Rawhide went from having the lowest attendance among all 120 fullseason minor league teams to breaking a 62-year-old attendance record in 2009, the first of four consecutive years of all-time record attendance. In 2012, Seidler was recognized as Executive of the Year, and the Rawhide was tabbed Organization of the Year in the California League.

Prior to leading the Rawhide, Seidler held various roles in professional baseball with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Port St. Lucie Dodgers/Kissimmee Dodgers, Great Falls Dodgers, Stockton Ports and Leones del Caracas. Since 1999, Seidler has served as president of the Mudville Nine Foundation for Kids, an organization focused on improving the education and athletic opportunities for children. Seidler earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Notre Dame and a Master of Business Administration from the Owen School at Vanderbilt University. He is a proud full-time resident of downtown San Diego and currently serves on the board of directors of the Downtown San Diego Partnership and Big Brothers, Big Sisters of San Diego County. Seidler also is a member of the Athletics Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of San Diego and a member of the San Diego Downtown Rotary Club 33.

4 WAY TEST

---- 1 ----Is it the **TRUTH**?

---- 2 ----Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?

Will it build GOODWILL and better FRIENDSHIPS?

Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

As Rotarians, we should have The Four-Way Test in mind in every decision we make, all day long. Our utmost responsibility is to Speak The Truth, to Be Fair, to Build Goodwill and Better Friendships, and to do our very best in all situations.

> 4 Way Test was developed in 1932 by Herbert J. Taylor.

Our Rotarian of the day was Rita Lim. She opened the meeting with pledge of allegiance ahead of invocation. Born in Malaysia of Chinese dissent, she lived in three continents. America is the first place that made her feel at home. As such, the pledge of allegiance is like a prayer to her. Malaysia is a Muslim country, where she escaped genocide, violence. She shared some words of wisdom: "if it is not truthful and not helpful - don't say it; if it is truthful and NOT helpful - don't say it; if it is truthful and helpful - wait for the right time". She practiced as a scientist for 20 plus years. The dark side of business (marketing, sales, etc.) made her change from being an introvert to an extrovert. She shared her experience about people (by drawing a parallel with different types of bananas (green ones, yellow ones and plastic ones)!

WE has been active both locally as well as internationally and has funded over 1500 small repayable business loans. The organization was founded in Dec. 2003 and one of the founders was our very own Jan Percival. In addition, Steve Brown was also very instrumental in directing Win to Rotary, who is now a member of Poway Rotary Club.
