

Know NO Limits. That was the theme of our speaker Oz Sanchez. Oz told us his remarkable story presenting a message of inspiration, perseverance and the power of human spirit. He grew up in east LA in the midst of gangs and drugs. Ultimately he found his way to the Marine Corps. After two deployments to the Middle East, he was on his way to becoming a Navy Seal when a motorcycle accident left him largely paralyzed from the waist down. After dealing with depression and a long down period he found a way to take control of his life. With dedication, perseverance and focus he became an award-winning Paralympian, winning gold medals at the Beijing ('08) and London ('12) Paralympic games. Realizing that his spinal cord was not completely severed, he ultimately found a way to stand and even walk again. (He dramatically demonstrated this as he stepped out of his wheelchair, stood at the podium and walked across the room.) He is now headed back to school for an MBA (he graduated from SDSU) and is delivering his motivational message wherever he can. The club stood with him in their ovation.

Rick Binder brought what he claimed was a Halloween joke to close the meeting. But we did leave with smiles on our faces.
