

# WSWA

& Current Holiday Campaign for Low-Income Service Workers



## Brandon McDonald

Background: Brandon is originally from the Chicagoland area. He graduated from the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana with a bachelor's degree in the Teaching of Social Studies in 1997. He taught middle school and high school for three years on the city's south side with students that lived in the notorious housing projects.

### HISTORY:

In 2000, he became a fulltime volunteer organizer with a membership association of low-income families, also on the south side of Chicago. There he helped build and expand the freeof-charge preventive medical and non-emergency dental benefits, as well as the legal advice benefit and emergency food, clothing and more. He assisted with organizing donated professional labor and materials for the renovation of the 100-year old Office Central. Brandon also organized students and professors from local universities, business owners and others to assist in organizing these benefits with the members. In addition, Brandon assisted in galvanizing the lowincome membership there to combat some of the root causes of poverty.

In late 2005, Brandon was invited to take on the position of Operations Manager for a similar organization in Santa Rosa, California. There he once again taught lowincome members and others how to build a preventive medical and non-emergency dental benefits to where dozens of low-income members would receive free, donated care every month. Under his leadership, the organization successfully stopped the closure of the principal hospital which poor and low-income people relied upon for care. In addition, they were able to lead a struggle to successfully stop the state of California from eliminating a program that provides in-home care for a half million poor elderly, blind and disabled recipients and which saves the state billions of dollars annually.

In July of 2013, Brandon had replaced himself as Operations Manager in Santa Rosa and was invited take on the position of Operations Manager with the 36 year-old Western Service Workers Association (WSWA) in San Diego. Since that time, WSWA has recruited 5 new volunteer attorneys, three new volunteer dentists and two new volunteer doctors who provide free services to some of San Diego County's lowestpaid workers and their families. Over the last two years, WSWA has done advocacy to stop water shut offs to dozens of low-income families throughout San Diego. Under Brandon's leadership, WSWA members began a campaign to encourage the city to issue a moratorium on water shut offs in San Diego.

## **FAMILY:**

This year Brandon's parents followed him to San Diego to enjoy its incomparable climate and vistas. They are also volunteers and supporters of WSWA and like Brandon they now call this county their home. Brandon's brother has a family in the Chicagoland area and travels the country servicing accounts with a successful telephony technology company.

## POVERTY

Our Pres, Ron Kohl, opened the meeting and introduced our youngest Rotarian, Marin Grillo as our Rotarian of the Day.

Marin shared many things with us including that she is a fourth generation Rotarian and her passion (now) is rock climbing - both inside and outside. She teaches rock climbing to others such as participants in the Wounded Warriors program! She also competes in the sport and I think all of us in attendance felt honored to have such a wonderful young lady as an aspiring member.

Schaffer Iennifer introduced our guests and visiting Rotarians. We had 2 visiting Rotarians from the downtown San Diego club and one from the La Jolla (La Valencia) club. For guests, our current Governor, Louise Andres introduced her long time (since age 15!) friend from Portland, OR. Then Marty Rosenstein introduced a group from the Preuss school including teachers and the parents of the student of the month.

Announcements included Pres Ron mentioning Sandy Rimer's Thousand Smiles set for February and then Pres-Elect Bev Fritschner announced various upcoming District events as well as a planned "Bridges" walk set for November 15.

Marty Rosenstein then introduced the Preuss School Student of the Month, Michelle Swan. Michelle is a senior at Preuss and maintains a very busy schedule that she shared with us. She founded the Art Club Foundation at the school and volunteers in the school library. An interesting tidbit is that the garden Club sells pot - oops - that was corrected by Brett Morey to pots - to raise funds. This very poised young lady has goals of majoring in English Literature and becoming an editor in NYC.

Our Past President and current Foundation Chair Brett Morey then gave a foundation presentation since November is Rotary Foundation Month - (who knew!). He asked that we all wear our Paul Harris pins during November and to get those pledges and cash in. He knows where we all live and work so better do as he asks!

Brett's presentation gave us insight as to where the Foundation monies go. Brett then awarded our own TV ad personality, John Stephan, his 6th Paul Harris award - good going John!

The president made an executive decree and said that, to give our speaker more time, instead of high 5's we had to do high 10's this morning. Contributors included Louise Anders, Mike Bardin and Father Wayne Sanders. Thank you all.

Then Louise **Anders** introduced our speaker, Deepa Willingham. Deepa is originally from Calcutta, India where she was taught at a young age by Mother Teresa (along with others). She is a former PDG of District 5240 and is a current resident of Solvang, CA.

Her presentation stressed the value of education and how so many in the world are living in extreme poverty. Education is one of the escape paths from poverty and crime. One of the quotes she had was from Aristotle and is "Poverty is the parent of revolution and crime" which still seems very relevant. She said the world population just surpassed 7 billion and, of that number, about half are living in extreme poverty which was defined as living on less than \$2 per day. 16 thousand kids in extreme poverty die each day, 2.8 billion have no health care access, etc. Also, in the world there are presently about 2.7 billion illiterate persons and 2/3 of them are women. Education can help all.

Another statistic was that child trafficking has risen to the  $2^{nd}$  largest crime in the world behind drugs. And, lest we feel smug within the USA, we too have a growing problem with child trafficking.

Deepa introduced Christine and their current project PACE. The initial site for this program is in India and stresses education girls and women. for Additional aspects of the program include water and sanitation systems, micro loans, utilities, etc. There is much to do in the world and Deepa and Christine spoke highly of the support their program has received through Rotary.

Our Pres, Ron Kohl closed the meeting with an attorney joke. Something to the effect that Tommy's dad is an attorney, but a regular one, not the honest kind! (With my apologies to the attorneys in the club.)



Engineering and transitioned into retired life.


