Cheryl Shields is the Founder/Director of A Night to Remember Prom. This is a FREE first-class prom for developmentally disabled or physically-challenged high school students who are integrated one-on-one with a volunteer mainstream student who serves as their host for the evening, making sure the Guests are the stars. A Night to Remember Prom was launched in 2011, with the goal to love, honor and celebrate students with special needs and to integrate these students with mainstream hosts so they develop an understanding and build new friendships. This 501(c)3 organization receives charitable contributions used to reimburse actual expenses of each year's event (no one, including **Cheryl**, takes a salary). Over the past 4 years, over 2,500 students have attended this event. They are expecting 850 students from 70 schools to attend in 2015.
