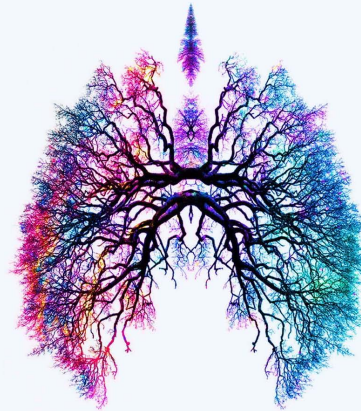

THE MYTHS AND TRUTHS OF THE NUMBER 1 CANCER KILLER IN AMERICA

After surviving SCLC (small cell lung cancer) in 2006, Nancy began her advocacy efforts, working initially with the National Lung Cancer Partnership on the 2nd Free to Breathe 5k walk/run in Philadelphia in 2007, and chairing the event in 2008 and 2009. Nancy served on the Board of the National Partnership and was President and founder of the Pennsylvania Lung Cancer Partnership in 2008, which raised \$1.5 million in 6 years under her leadership. Since relocating to San Diego in 2013 after the death of her mother

to join her daughter on the west coast, she has participated in most of the lung cancer walks in San Diego, and has chosen to work with ALA's LungForce in California.

In her "other" world, Nancy has over thirty years of management experience in consumer and commercial banking. Nancy holds her BA from the College of William and Mary, with some post-graduate work at Drexel University. She has held the Series 7 and 66 financial licenses as well as life and health insurance licenses.

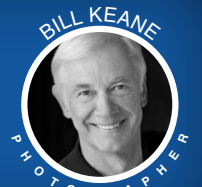
