www.groundswellcommunity.org LMFT (licensed Marriage and Family Therapist) received her undergrad degree in Psychology and Philosophy at Point Loma Nazarene University, Masters in Marriage and Family Therapy at Bethel Seminary University, and received training through the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association. Originally from North Carolina she calls San Diego Bay home aboard her 28ft sail boat, Mi Corazon. In 2016 she combined her profession as a therapist with her passion for all things ocean and founded the non-profit Groundswell Community Project. Groundswell Community Project was founded with the mission to heal, empower, and unite women in the waves through surf therapy and ocean conservation programs.

Groundswell brings women from all over the world together who are overcoming abuse, trauma, trafficking, addiction, displacement, depression, and anxiety to diver deeper into self

love, ocean love, and sisterhood through Surf Therapy. Groundswell has grown from serving 15 women from a local recovery center in 2016 to serving over 500 women along the coasts of California, Peru, and Cuba. They are proud to be part of International Surf Therapy Org and partnering with UCSD to do research that will help show the transformational effects that surf therapy has on the brain for trauma recovery and mental health. "Groundswell's surf therapy program opened a new world up to me and I saw it do the same for the other women. It connected us to the ocean, to each other, and to ourselves. With each wave I felt my old traumas and fears wash away and found myself full of strength and joy I didn't know possible" -Groundswell participant 2018
