Point Loma Nazarene University and a Masters in Marriage and Family Therapy at Bethel Seminary University. She had a passion for the ocean and found a way to incorporate her love of surfing with her professional passions. In addition to her formal eight week surf therapy camps, she also has put on surf camps for Syrian refugee girls, and travelled to Peru to teach women how to empower themselves and overcome their own personal traumas through surfing. One of the participants in her surf camp, and now a board members of her non-profit, Leanne Tibiatowski, talked to us about her personal experience with the surf camp, in what was a powerful moment that showed the progress that can be made within a supporting healing environment. Natalie left us with a teaching lesson on how we can and should remind ourselves that we make the world beautiful.
