ERIN PARKS



Dr. Erin Parks is a clinical psychologist and the Director of Outreach and Admissions for the UCSD Eating Disorder Center for Treatment & Research. **Dr. Parks** is a graduate of Northwestern University and UCSD/SDSU's Joint Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology, where she specialized in neuropsychology and conducted neuroimaging research of child development.

Dr. Parks began working at the UCSD Eating Disorder Center for her post-doctoral fellowship. She has worked as a clinician in the Adolescent Clinic, was the founding manager of the Pediatric Clinic, and co-managed the Adult Clinic. She has also worked as a psychologist on the inpatient Medical Behavioral Unit (MBU) and co-lead the Intensive Family Therapy (IFT) program. As Director of Outreach and Admissions, **Dr. Parks** current focus is on how to best educate clinicians, parents, and the community about the neurobiological basis of eating disorders and the evidence-based treatments that are now available.

There was another reminder that this month there would be a collection of books for the literary Council and a thank you letter was read because of our past efforts. Finally **President Rick** mentioned that there had been a Board meeting yesterday and **they were looking for some technical expertise to help with public relations** and in particular website updates. **Janine** stepped up!

President Rick introduced the Speaker for the morning, the CEO of Goodwill **Toni Giffin**, She has been at Goodwill 19 years but only recently became the CEO. She explained the organization history of collecting donations **but made it clear**

they were more than just that. Goodwill provided training and employment opportunities for people with **intellectual, developmental and physical disabilities** - and this provided the connection between the retail stores and the mission.

San Diego Goodwill had 24 retail stores, 6 book stores and a number of employment centers helping people gain job skills. Goodwill employees were also ambassadors for the organization with newly found career paths. She had a goal to get at least 1 person with a disability in every business in the community.

Beyond helping people with disabilities, Goodwill has a veterans program, a young adult program and actively recruited from underserved communities. **Toni** felt like explaining the depth and breadth of Goodwill's work was one of her most important jobs.

Dr. Kelly Price Noble is the Program Chair, West District (nine states), for the College of Health Professions, School of Health Services Administration at University of Phoenix.

Dr. Price is the Principal of KAPN Consulting: Innovative Solutions, LLC, *connecting people to people*. May 2018, she launched Blessed with Activity and published *Blessed with Activity: A Mindfulness Journey*.

She earned an Emmy nomination for Gallaudet University's *Fantastic*, a television program geared toward deaf and hard of hearing children and was a recipient of the 1987 TV & Film Festival for her work on PBS' Wall Street with Louis Rukeyser.

For more than a decade, she was affiliated with the United States Navy as a member of the Navy Wifeline Association and several Navy Spouse Clubs around the globe, including Agana, Guam and Rota, Spain. She received formal training as Causality Assistance Calls Officer (CACO) and provided support with base activities in conjunction with Fairconron One & Two.

Currently, she is the California Diversity Council's SoCal/San Diego Education Chair and the California Institute for Human Science's Diversity and Inclusion Chair.
