Financial Outlook for San Diego

Todd Lane, MBA, is currently President/Chief Executive Officer for California Coast Credit Union, a \$2 billion credit union based in San Diego. Mr. Lane was named President in June of 2014 and became President/CEO on January 1, 2015. Mr. Lane had served as Chief Financial Officer for California Coast Credit Union since 2009. He also serves as Vice Chair on the Cal Coast Foundation Board, which provides grants and scholarships to schools, students and educators in San Diego and Riverside counties.

Prior to joining to the credit union, Mr. Lane was the President/Chief Executive Officer of Executive Compensation Solutions based in Covina, California and prior to that was the EVP/CFO for a Western Corporate Federal Credit Union. In total, he has held executive positions in the financial services industry for over 30 years. Mr. Lane received his BS in Finance from San Diego State University and his MBA from Pepperdine University. Todd has served on both for-profit and non-profit Boards, including several years on a Board of Trustees directing retirement assets.

He currently serves as Chairman of the RMJ Foundation, where their principal efforts are directed towards youth financial education and is past President of the AOBT Foundation which supports a business-based academy at Clairemont High School here in San Diego.

As part of our club's community outreach, we present an award to a **person, business** or **organization** that has worked to enhance the quality of life in the Golden Triangle. **The Hahn Visionary Award** was created in 1992 to honor the late Ernest W. Hahn, a beloved civic booster and a legend in the shopping center business.

[From the 1950's to the 1980's, his company, Ernest W. Hahn, Inc., built shopping malls in 18 states, from Florida to Oregon. It made him a millionaire 200 times over, according to Forbes Magazine.]

Since then, the Hahn Visionary Award has sought to recognize people (and organizations) who have made a difference in our community. Several of our club members have received the award including Craig Clark, Harry Mathis and co-founder Ted Owen. Other previous winners include The Braille Institute, the late Dr. Charles Nathanson, Preuss Charter School/Peter Preuss, EDUCATE, the late William Otterson, La Jolla Playhouse, George Lattimer, Ambassador Ted Gildred, Chancellor Atkinson, and Assistant Chief of Police Boyd Long.

As we revive the Hahn Visionary Award, we're looking to identify our community's heroes: people who have toiled -- with or without fanfare -- to make a difference in the Golden Triangle region.

If you want to nominate someone for the Hahn Visionary Award, here's what you need to do:

1. Please prepare a brief narrative explaining why this person or organization should be honored. Please provide as much supporting documentation as possible.
2. This person or organization needs to have a logical link to the Golden Triangle – they either live or work in our community.

4. Deadline for submissions is January 10, 2018.

Members of the Vocational Services Committee will judge the nominations and a winner will be presented to the club during Q1 2018.

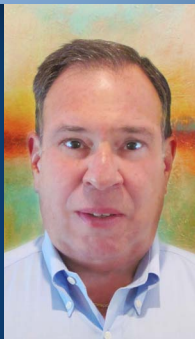
